## TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

As we look at our lives and world events, do we ever find ourselves wondering if God is sleeping? After all, maybe God's patient, unconditional love has run its course and He is finally fed up with humanity's reluctance to accept the truth about who we are. God really can't be that patient! All throughout human history, many have prayed to God for intervention or for particular needs. Because their prayers were not answered in the way they wanted or anticipated, they felt that God may have abandoned them. Were they right? It seems that we are continuing, at a rapid rate, down a path of destruction. Do you not care, God, that we may be perishing? When the boats of our lives are rocking and the seas tumultuous, we want to know that we have God's attention. Even more so, we want God's intervention.

Maybe the storms and the waves are necessary. If we listen, they can teach us valuable lessons. Without them, we would never learn that we have the strength to endure, understand the uselessness of fear and worry, or develop the ability to really trust. God permits us to ride out the difficult stuff knowing that the storm will eventually be calmed. Do we not have faith that God will do this? True faith trusts in the steadfastness of God's love when the seas are calm and when they are choppy. God's unconditional loving presence shines through all of it and endures forever. Knowing that we prefer the comfort and safety of what we know to be still waters, how do we feel when Jesus says, "Let us cross to the other side"?

## PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

At a wedding I attended a few years ago, a young child was present who thought she should be a little more involved in the wedding than had been planned. Since her mother was the matron of honor, her father was caring for her. When her first scream let loose, her father picked her up and hurried toward an exit. A few moments later, daughter and father returned to the church, and took their place in the congregation. Another scream signaled another exit, and in a few moments, I noticed dad and daughter walking hand-in-hand in the vestibule. When the young child insisted that she join mom in the wedding procession, there was another exit, I am sure this young girl was delighted when the wedding ceremony ended, so she could move on to the next event. Through all of this, her father was wonderfully patient and attentive to his daughter.

I thought of this incident because today is **Father's Day**, a day annually set aside to remember our fathers who were and are present in our lives. It is a day to honor the fathers who often made significant sacrifices for their children. Fathers who take pride in their children stand tall today. It is also a day to remind fathers of the wonderful vocation God has given to them. The very fact that God entrusts innocent human life into our human hands to mold and shape, to love and encourage, and to experience pride and satisfaction, in a wonderful sign of divine trust and reliance. Father's Day gives us the chance to say to our dads what we should probably be saying every day of the year.

For those of us who have given our fathers back to God, Father's Day is a day of warm remembrances. It invites us to travel back in time when we were growing up and needed advice (which we sometimes failed to heed); when we felt security when dad was near, when we felt there was someone to turn to for advice and assurance. These memories also remind us of the powerful influence our fathers had on our lives. Some of their suggestions we might laugh at today, but they were a challenge at the time they were given. Today we can look back and treasure those times and those special moments that we shared with our fathers.

For those who still have the gift of your father, today is a day to be shared. It is the crazy breakfast that is prepared, the fun activities involved in the day, the cards that are exchanged, the "thing" dad likes to do, and the family gatherings. All of these activities are an invitation to share in the ways that set the day apart and make it special. After all, tomorrow's memories are created by what we do today.

Father's Day is a wonderful time to offer a word of prayerful thanks to God for our fathers. It is God who sends people into our lives to nurture us and guide us in God's name. As we offer prayers for our fathers on this day, and every day, for that matter, we ask God to continue to bless our fathers as they continue to live out this vocation that God has lovingly given to them.

### A Rice Bowl Thank You

Our Lenten almsgiving project raised \$2,348.06 for Catholic Relief Services Operation Rice Bowl. These funds have been sent to our diocesan office. From there, 75% will be forwarded to CRS and 25% to the Horseheads Food Pantry located at the Horseheads First Presbyterian Church on Westinghouse Road. While this was only about 60% of the amount we were able to raise during the pre-pandemic years, it is remarkable given the restrictions and uncertainty caused by the pandemic in early spring. CRS will use your donations to help fund their projects in developing countries. This year's program highlighted the needs of the peoples of Madagascar, El Salvador, and Timore Leste. Through CRS printed materials and videos, we were able to learn more about these three countries. ### Thanks to All Who Helped

The NYS legislature voted recently to establish NOURISH New York, the state's farm to food bank initiative as a permanent state program. This initiative, launched in April 2020, provides funding to New York food banks and church and community food pantries to purchase New York State produce and dairy products to distribute to those seeking assistance. To date, food banks have purchased 21 million pounds of agricultural products, which fed 1.3 million food-insecure people throughout the state. In addition to helping provide food to the hungry, NOURISH New York expands market opportunities for farmers and minimizes agricultural product waste. Thank you to those who advocated this program through your legislators.

Elders in the NYS prison system are denied parole again and again, even after being incarcerated for decades. Releasing them to their families would not only save millions of tax dollars, it would give them the opportunity to serve their communities.

There's still time to convince the legislative leaders to call for a vote on the two bills we're supporting:

#### Fair and Timely Parole (S.1415/A.4231) Elder Parole (S.15/A.3475)
