#### THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The author of *The Cloud of Unknowing* prays, "That which I am and the way that I am, with all my gifts of nature and grace, you have given to me, O Lord, and you are all this. I offer it all to you, principally to praise you and to help my fellow Christians and myself." Knowing that God sustains us in being is the key to faith. All that we need to do is to love God as God is and the rest will begin to fall into place. God made us in His image and desires that we have life. God also desires that we be healed of all of our wounds, especially those caused by sin, and know his loving touch. Being weighed down by negativity, imperfections, the cares of the world, and weakness is not something that God desires.

Faith can profoundly change how we see God, ourselves, and one another. It gives a clearer lens through which to see life and connects us with the powerful virtues of love and hope. Three friends journeying with us through all that we encounter, faith, hope, and love, help us experience God's embrace and heal us. All we have to do is let God be who God is and not foolishly try to make Him into what we need or want Him to be. Without God we cease to be. It's that simple. The very blood that flows through my veins and the life that I have come directly from Divine origins. With this knowledge of who God is and who I am, I can open my ears and hear the powerful words Jesus speaks, "Do not be afraid, just have faith." Trust begins.

When we are struggling, we naturally reach out for God because we know that a divine remedy is the only remedy. But, in doing so we wrestle with letting God take charge. We want something more miraculous and visible than the obvious and have difficulty in finding consolation simply resting in God's presence. Reach out in love to God. Ask God to heal you from all that separates you from Him. Put aside any ideas of God that create barriers between you and God's tender and endearing presence. The Cloud of Unknowing leaves us with wisdom, "think of yourself and of Him in the same way, that is, with the simple awareness that He is as He is and that you are as you are." This is a meeting of two friends who desire nothing more than to share life together.

#### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

This is the season for graduations! Many of the colleges and universities have already held their commencement ceremonies in late April, May, and June, all with the covid-19 protocols in place! This past Tuesday, we held the sixth grade celebration for St. Mary Our Mother School in the church. A week ago this past Friday, the 2021 graduating class from Notre Dame High School held their commencement exercises, while the students from Horseheads High School are scheduled to graduate this past Wednesday, weather permitting! Thomas A. Edison, Odessa-Montour, and the Corning-Painted Post Schools held graduations as well. We offer all graduates, whether they be from colleges, universities, high school, middle, elementary schools, our congratulations and best wishes! As members of our parish community, we're proud of you and grateful for the love and support your parents, families and church community have given you.

With the number of graduations which have been held in recent weeks, we oftentimes read of news stories of the world's 'famous' people who speak at these graduations. Often, they give bits of wisdom and advice to the graduates. If you were so honored to speak at such commencement exercises, what pearls of wisdom and/or advice would you offer those who are graduating?

On a recent newscast I heard a number of these words of wisdom given to graduates. "don't forget, you are a child of God," was one message. Others include: "Don't listen to negativity, follow the call to greatness that stirs your heart, education is just the beginning, let the spirit surprise you, there are no mistakes, God is taking you down this road for a reason, ask yourself a few questions".

One of my favorite words of graduation advice was from a graduation address at the **Seaver College** at **Pepperdine University** many years ago by Baseball Hall of Fame broadcaster, Vin Scully, entitled "Difficult, but Possible". In his address Vin cited many examples of people who overcame tremendous challenges in life to play major league baseball players with one eye, a player who was deaf, a player who suffered a major heart attack, and returned to play less than a year later, even a player who played without a right arm. In his concluding remarks, Mr. Scully said, "I could wish that you avoid the storms of life, but what I can do is to encourage you to learn to dance in the rain! You can do it!" Very insightful words as we continue to emerge from this pandemic.

Have a great week. It hardly seems possible this is the last Sunday of June. Continue to take care of yourself and each other.

#### Religious Freedom Week June 22 - June 29, 2021

From the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops:

"Religious freedom allows the Church, and all religious communities, to live out their faith in public and to serve the good of all. Beginning June 22, the USCCB invites Catholics to **pray**, **reflect**, and **act** to promote religious freedom."

Note from the editor of Justice, Peace, and Life newsletter:

I'll be honest. When I hear Christians in the U.S. bemoan attacks on their religious freedom, I roll my eyes a little. We are by far the most dominant religious group in this country, and many if not most people who hold power - in elected office and in business - identify as Christian. Compared to countries in which religious minorities are oppressed, exiled and killed, our complaints seem overexaggerated.

But...I challenge myself and all Catholics to study the materials on Religious Freedom Week at www.usccb.org/committees/religious-liberty/religious-freedom-week.

There you'll learn about a variety of issues, from rights for health care workers and a disturbing uptick in church vandalism to the violent persecution of Catholics in Nicaragua and of Christians in general in Iraq.

There are many issues related to religious freedom to pray about, and to be vigilant about, as well as many reasons to still be thankful for the freedoms we enjoy in this country.

#### Thanks to All Who Helped

The NYS legislature voted recently to establish NOURISH New York, the state's farm to food bank initiative as a permanent state program. This initiative, launched in April 2020, provides funding to New York food banks and church and community food pantries to purchase New York State produce and dairy products to distribute to those seeking assistance. To date, food banks have purchased 21 million pounds of agricultural products, which fed 1.3 million food-insecure people throughout the state. In addition to helping provide food to the hungry, NOURISH New York expands market opportunities for farmers and minimizes agricultural product waste. Thank you to those who advocated this program through your legislators.

#### WHAT IS THE MIRACULOUS MEDAL?

The medal of the Immaculate Conception that has come to be called simply the "Miraculous Medal" dates back to an apparition of Mary to Saint Catherine Laboure, who was then a novice sister with the Daughters of Charity. On November 27, 1830, Our Lady appeared to her standing on a globe, with shafts of light streaming from her hands and the words, "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee," surrounding the image. In the same vision, Catherine saw a capital "M" with a cross above it and below two hearts. Catherine seemed to hear a voice telling her to have what she saw struck as a medal and a promise that those who wore the medal would have the protection and intercession of the Mother of God. The first 1,500 of medals were distributed in 1832. Many miraculous favors were attributed to the use of the medal.

Saint Catherine's "Miraculous Medal" is among the recognizable and popular symbols of modern Catholicism. Reflecting on its widespread use, the 2001 Vatican document, "Directory on Popular Piety and Liturgy," observes that the medal "recalls the mystery of Redemption, the love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and of the Sorrowful Heart of Mary. It signifies the mediatory role of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the mystery of the Church, the relationship between Heaven and earth, this life and eternal life."
