CREATING A SAFE ENVIRONMENT (CASE) MANDATORY TRAINING FOR PARISH VOLUNTEERS

In March 2021, the Diocese of Rochester updated its *Volunteer Creating a Safe Environment (CASE) Policy* to include ALL volunteers, not just those who work with children or vulnerable adults. The training is offered in an easy to use online program. Volunteers will be required to sign a Code of Conduct and complete a background check prior to starting your volunteer service.

This mandatory CASE training must be renewed every three years (volunteers over 70 years of age who have previously completed CASE training are only required to complete the background check and Code of Conduct forms).

With the new policy, all ushers, cantors, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, Faith Formation and youth group volunteers are required to be CASE trained.

Since this training is mandatory, if a person does not complete it, unfortunately, he/she can no longer volunteer

We greatly appreciate our volunteers and sincerely hope that you are looking forward to continuing your volunteer service/ministry to our parish.

UPDATED COVID-19 PROTOCOL

Due to the Covid-19 cases in our area, we are exercising extra caution to keep our parishioners and staff safe, especially those who are not vaccinated. Until further notice, masks are required whenever you are in a church building, including when attending Mass. This applies to everyone old enough to safely wear a mask, regardless of vaccination status. We are not at this time implementing any additional registration, social distancing, nor extra sanitizing procedures.

One half of the church seating will continue to be "open seating" with all rows open. The other half will be blocked off at every other row, for those more comfortable with social distancing. When you enter a pew row, please move to the furthest open seating area, so that others can fill in the row behind you. Thank you.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

For over forty years, there has been an annual campaign seeking financial support for the many ministries and outreach services of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Rochester, known as the Catholic Ministries Appeal. It supports the on-going work of the ministry in all parishes of the diocese.

The theme of this year's appeal is "Forward in Faith." The Catholic Ministries Appeal is encouraging us again to be supportive of the valuable ministries and services offered to our entire diocese. Every registered parishioner should receive a letter concerning the CMA within the next week or two. I hope you will read this letter and prayerfully respond with a gift to help our parish meet its financial obligation for this year's Catholic Ministries Appeal. Our parish goal for this year is \$106,251.00, which has been reduced from last year's goal of \$112,209.00. As you are aware, we are responsible for any shortfall to this year's goal.

A question that is often asked each year concerning the Catholic Ministries Appeal is the question: "How are the goals for each parish determined for this appeal?" A noteworthy question! Each parish goal was recalculated on three factors: 2019 Mass attendance, 2020 collections and 2020 households. For the income factor, the Diocese of Rochester used the "2019 American Community Service (ACS) from the U.S Census Bureau. The Income Factor has always been based on the household zip codes, however, the methodology employed by the U. S. Census Bureau has been refined." Thus the reason for the reduction of this year's goal.

As our Church continues to navigate through challenging times, the Catholic Ministries Appeal has helped fund:

Extended networks to church buildings and schools, and installed cameras necessary to support virtual ministry;

Cybersecurity platforms to protect parishes, schools, and Catholic Charities agencies against data breaches:

Advocacy and education through the Office of Life issues;

Campus Ministry stipends to support important outreach taking place on college campuses throughout the diocese;

Support and organization of numerous Confirmation and Hands of Christ Award celebrations;

Development and publication of "The Family **Zone**", a lectionary based newsletter/playlist for families:

Updated resources for RCIA training;

Sacramental ministry and outreach to the Migrant Centers - a significant source of spiritual life in our diocese.
