When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.

#### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Today we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, which brings the liturgical season of Advent/ Christmas/Epiphany to a close. This time each year, there is a sense of sadness when it comes to taking down the glowing lights and festive seasonal decorations of Christmas. On my ventures on December 26th, I passed a house where they were already taking down the outside decorations of their home! As the saying goes, "time marches on," and our church's liturgical calendar unfolds into the fullness of time, but it is bittersweet to say farewell to the Christmas season. It is my hope that you were able to celebrate and enjoy Christmas a bit more than last year.

Because of early deadlines for our weekly bulletin—last Sunday's bulletin went to press on December 12th, and we were still anticipating Christmas. While our Christmas Masses have been less festive for the last two years, the Christmas Mass attendance was over twice the number of people that joined us last year. It was so good to see many people we haven't seen in a while, making an effort to worship with us at Christmas. We continue to be committed to making our church and worship area a clean and safe environment.

## WE ARE ONE SYNODAL CHURCH What is a Synod?

The word "synod" may be new to many Catholics, but the reality described by it has been part of the life of the church since Apostolic times.

"Synod" comes from two Greek words meaning, "walking together." A synod is an ecclesial gathering with the goal of discerning what the Holy Spirit is asking of the Church at the time.

Synodality represents the main road for the church, called to renew herself under the action of the Spirit and by listening to the Word. The ability to imagine a different future for the Church and her institutions, in keeping with the mission she has received, depends largely on the decision to initiate processes of listening, dialogue, and community discernment, in which each and every person can participate and contribute.

At the same time, the decision to "journey together" is a prophetic sign for the human family, which needs a shared project capable of pursuing the good of all.

As we enter the new year we encourage all our parishioners, at any age and at any place in their faith journey to contribute and share their thoughts about the future of the church.

The purpose of the synod is to "plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and vision, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands."

We look forward to an open dialogue together while we listen, speak out, celebrate, and form ourselves in synodality.


