The true Christmas spirit, as shown by the generous and caring people of St. Mary Our Mother Parish, was apparent again this year. Our Social Ministry Committee partnered with the Horseheads Food Pantry to provide hams for Christmas dinner for families in need of assistance.

We reached out to our parishioners for donations to the Food Pantry to purchase hams and the response was overwhelming - we received **\$4,336.00** in donations. This was more than enough to purchase the hams. Excess donations to the ham project will be used by the Pantry to purchase fresh food and meat as needed for the families during the difficult winter months.

Also, a group of generous individuals, who attend daily Mass, donated potatoes to be given to the families. This group of parishioners have done this for many, many years. A special thanks to the kind gentleman from this group who organized the purchase and delivery of the potatoes.

All of these contributions from our parishioners, along with the food that is collected each week, has helped the Food Pantry immensely during these difficult times. They are very grateful for the generosity of St. Mary Our Mother parish.

WE ARE ONE SYNODAL CHURCH

What is a Synod?

The word "synod" may be new to many Catholics, but the reality described by it has been part of the life of the church since Apostolic times.

"Synod" comes from two Greek words meaning, "walking together." A synod is an ecclesial gathering with the goal of discerning what the Holy Spirit is asking of the Church at the time.

Synodality represents the main road for the church, called to renew herself under the action of the Spirit and by listening to the Word. The ability to imagine a different future for the Church and her institutions, in keeping with the mission she has received, depends largely on the decision to initiate processes of listening, dialogue, and community discernment, in which each and every person can participate and contribute.

At the same time, the decision to "journey together" is a prophetic sign for the human family, which needs a shared project capable of pursuing the good of all.

As we enter the new year we encourage all our parishioners, at any age and at any place in their faith journey to contribute and share their thoughts about the future of the church.

The purpose of the synod is to "plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and vision, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands."

We look forward to an open dialogue together while we listen, speak out, celebrate, and form ourselves in synodality.

DIOCESE OF ROCHESTER PERMANENT DIACONATE

The deacon is a man of faith, who is called from the community that already recognizes his dedication to service. He makes a lifetime commitment to serving the People of God by proclaiming the Word, assisting and presiding at liturgies, and minister in the areas of charity and social justice. A deacon gives witness to his availability to the community by addressing present and emerging needs of the Church.

The Diocese is inviting interested men of strong and active faith, who can demonstrate a record of service in the communities in which they live, work and worship, who may wish to explore a possible call to ordained ministry as a permanent deacon, to first speak with their pastor for an initial conversation. They may also contact Deacon Edward Giblin, Director of the Office of the Permanent Diaconate at Edward.giblin@dor.org for additional information. A potential candidate must be at least 35 years of age and no older than 62 years at the time of ordination after a five (5) year period of formation.

He must be in good health, emotionally mature, have stable relationships and must have the wholehearted support of his wife (if married) and family to enter the phase of inquire. Because the parish is the primary experience of Church for most inquirers, the parish community is asked as well to invite from among its members men who exhibit strong faith and a spirit of service and encourage them to consider a possible vocation to a permanent diaconate.
