

The non-refundable registration fee is \$150.00 per family. Both before and after school care are available. #### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Many of you have already heard that Pope Francis I has called for the entire Church to enter a General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops from October, 2021 through October, 2023.

The theme for this unprecedented Synod is: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission." This Synod is unlike any other Synod in the history of the Church in that Pope Francis I is seeking the participation of every baptized Catholic across the whole world - young, old, marginalized, laity, consecrated religious, and the ordained.

This Synod will extend over a three year period beginning now with a local diocesan phase, and continuing with a Continental Phase in September, 2022, then culminating in October, 2023, with a Universal Phase when the bishops of the world will meet in Rome to review what the entire Church is thinking and living.

A Synod is a gathering of those "on the same path" for sharing, reflecting, and listening to each other to carry out our mission as Church. Since the beginning of the Church, Synods have been mainly gatherings of bishops, experts, and other invited delegates. Pope Francis I wants this Synod to be a "gathering" of the entire Church for we are all on the same paths.

The purpose of this Synod, unlike the fifteen Synods previously held, is not to produce documents but to "plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to be nourished, inspire trust and relationships, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another, and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands." (PD 32)

Every person is invited to provide input into this process from now until March 31, 2022. I will be talking more about the Synod in future bulletins. I also encourage you to visit the diocesan website, dor.org/synod, for further information. We also will try to place a link to the Synod on our parish website. Please give some consideration how you might like to participate in order to have your voice heard in this process. Together we are "the Church listening to the will of God in a dynamic of discerning and listening together to the voice of the Holy Spirit." (Pope Francis I)

#### **REGIONAL EVENTS**

2022 Diocesan Public Policy Weekend - 2/12 & 2/13 Care for the Marginalized through an Equitable & Just NYS Budget

Next weekend is Diocesan Public Policy Weekend. We will have an opportunity to speak up for the babies/toddlers growing up in poverty in our community and for community mental/behavioral health services. Our message to the Governor and state leaders:

In order to be truly "New York Strong" we must first take care of those most vulnerable in our state. One way to do this is to create a budget that uses equity and justice as its guiding principles. There are many important initiatives that need to be supported, but two that we would like to advocate for are the closing of the NYS Child Tax Credit loophole so that it will cover those who are most vulnerable, children ages 0-4. The second issue we are raising up is our concern for the over 40% of New Yorkers who have reported struggles with their mental health during the pandemic, many of whom have not been able to receive the treatment they need due to lack of

providers. Many service providers are finding it extremely difficult to provide the critical services at current rates. Therefore, we are also petitioning for a 5.4% COLA and a \$500 million investment in workforce, service and support in the Executive Budget.

Our Diocesan Public Policy Committee is encouraging everyone to sign the petition calling for an Equitable and Just New York State Budget on **February 12/13** - *Diocesan Public Policy Advocacy Weekend.* You can sign the petition online at <a href="https://www.dor.org/petition/">https://www.dor.org/petition/</a> or sign the copy that will be in your bulletin on February 5/6. Bring the signed petition to Mass on February 12/13 and deposit it in the basket provided on the table in the vestibule. Thank you for caring about babies and toddlers and vulnerable people in need of mental health services.

#### FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDNARY TIME

"Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man," these words, uttered by Simon Peter, can be found on any one of our lips. What real significance do I have in the big picture of God's divine plan? Even though we try our best to hide it, we all suffer from a lack of faith. We get tired, confused, and often lack any sincere desire to put anything into our relationship with God. It's easier to simply reap whatever benefits the world has to offer and call it a day. Floating along on the superficial currents of life doesn't require much effort and seems to get us through the day. Confronting our own infidelity, apathy, weakness of spirit, and doubt in God's providence, how can we even remotely be considered a worthy vessel of God's presence or credible voice for His message?

This is the irony of faith. God doesn't seek the perfect vessels. He likes the broken ones. There is something to be said about living honestly and sincerely, and wrestling with sin, imperfection, and weakness rather than skipping through the peripheries of life with pretention, arrogance, and mendacity. If we believe ourselves to be our own "god" and serve only ourselves, we close the door to ever being used by the real and only True God. But, if we at least acknowledge that there is One greater than ourselves, then even in our deepest poverty and lowliness, God can enter.

Lessons are best learned from those who suffer. Only someone who has been lonely and lost can attest to the beauty of both Divine and human friendship. Only those who have really lost their way know what happens when they are found. Only those who are afraid know what it is to be calmed by God. The Gospel is messy because life is messy. There are no black and white solutions to problems and challenges that are hazy and gray. When our hesitancy to encounter God gets replaced by friendship with God, we become more aware of our dignity and the fact that we are loved just as we are. We cannot be afraid to share our struggles, reservations, fears, and sinfulness with others. Our genuineness and sincerity will speak of the God who blesses us in our weakness.
