PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

I mentioned in this column last week that Pope Francis I has invited the entire Church throughout the world to enter into a process of a Synod, with the Synod's theme being: For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission. In the words of Francis: "The challenge of being a Synodal Church is the 'journeying together' - laity, pastors, the Bishop of Rome. This is what God is asking of us and is present in some ways already." (Pope Francis, October 17, 2015)

The Synod will focus on the three key aspects of Communion, Participation and Mission. These three dimensions are vital pillars of a Synodal Church, with each one enriching the other two.

Communion: By His gracious will, God gathers us together as diverse peoples of one faith, through the covenant that He offers to His people. The communion we share is deeply rooted in that love and united of the Trinity. It is Christ who reconciles us to the Father and unites us with the Holy Spirit. Together, we are inspired by listening to the word of God, through the living tradition of the Church, and grounding in the faith we share. All of us have a role to play in discerning and living God's call to His people.

Participation: A call for the involvement of all who belong to the People of God - laity, consecrated, and ordained - to engage in the exercise of deep and respectful listening to one another. This listening creates space for us to hear the Holy Spirit together and guides our aspirations for the Church of the third millennium. The entire community, in the free and rich diversity of its members, is called together to pray, listen, analyze, dialogue, discern, and offer advice on making decisions which correspond as closely as possible to God's will. Mission: Our mission is to witness the love of God in the midst of the whole human family. This Synodal Process has a deeply missionary dimension to it. It is intended to enable the Church to better witness to the Gospel, especially with those who live in the spiritual, social, economic, political, geographical, and existential peripheries of our world. In this way, synodality is a path by which the Church can more fully fruitfully fulfill her mission of evangelization in the world, as a leaven at the service of the coming of God's kingdom.

The Key convictions of a Synodal Church include:

Listening to one another can be an authentic experience of discerning the will of the Holy Spirit.

Meditation, grounded in the liturgy, sacred scripture, and prayer prepares us for shared reflection and conversation.

Experiences shared with one another, not just filling out a questionnaire, lead to discerning hearts and minds.

REGIONAL EVENTS

2022 Diocesan Public Policy Weekend - 2/12 & 2/13 Care for the Marginalized through an Equitable & Just NYS Budget

This weekend is Diocesan Public Policy Weekend. We will have an opportunity to speak up for the babies/toddlers growing up in poverty in our community and for community mental/behavioral health services. Our message to the Governor and state leaders:

In order to be truly "New York Strong" we must first take care of those most vulnerable in our state. One way to do this is to create a budget that uses equity and justice as its guiding principles. There are many important initiatives that need to be supported, but two that we would like to advocate for are the closing of the NYS Child Tax Credit loophole so that it will cover those who are most vulnerable, children ages 0-4. The second issue we are raising up is our concern for the over 40% of New Yorkers who have reported struggles with their mental health during the pandemic, many of whom have not been able to receive the treatment they need due to lack of providers. Many service providers are finding it extremely difficult to provide the critical services at current rates. Therefore, we are also petitioning for a 5.4% COLA and a \$500 million investment in workforce, service and support in the Executive Budget.

Our Diocesan Public Policy Committee is encouraging everyone to sign the petition calling for an Equitable and Just New York State Budget on **February 12/13** - *Diocesan Public Policy Advocacy Weekend*. You can sign the petition online at https://www.dor.org/petition/. Bring the signed petition to Mass on this weekend, February 12/13 and deposit it in the basket provided on the table in the vestibule. Thank you for caring about babies and toddlers and vulnerable people in need of mental health services.

GOSPEL SYNODAL CONNECTIONS

Jesus spoke to a multitude of disciples and followers about the rewards that await those who live in His ways especially through adversity. Isn't this the message of the Church left to us by Christ Jesus and shared with us by the Apostles in our day? Synod theme #4 -Celebrating tells us that "Journeying together is only possible if it is based in prayer, on a communal listening to the word of God and the celebration of the Eucharist." (PD 30 #4) What joy and freedom can be found when we live life as we ought and help others follow the same path together. This is very possible when we listen to the needs of those we set out to journey together with and understand what is keeping them from entering the path toward the joy and celebration of Jesus. DIOCESE OF ROCHESTER PERMANENT DIACONATE

The deacon is a man of faith, who is called from the community that already recognizes his dedication to service. He makes a lifetime commitment to serving the People of God by proclaiming the Word, assisting and presiding at liturgies, and minister in the areas of charity and social justice. A deacon gives witness to his availability to the community by addressing present and emerging needs of the Church.

The Diocese is inviting interested men of strong and active faith, who can demonstrate a record of service in the communities in which they live, work and worship, who may wish to explore a possible call to ordained ministry as a permanent deacon, to first speak with their pastor for an initial conversation. They may also contact Deacon Edward Giblin, Director of the Office of the Permanent Diaconate at Edward.giblin@dor.org for additional information. A potential candidate must be at least 35 years of age and no older than 62 years at the time of ordination after a five (5) year period of formation. He must be in good health, emotionally mature, have stable relationships and must have the wholehearted support of his wife (if married) and family to enter the phase of inquire. Because the parish is the primary experience of Church for most inquirers, the parish community is asked as well to invite from among its members men who exhibit strong faith and a spirit of service and encourage them to consider a possible vocation to a permanent diaconate.

But to exercise good stewardship over God's gifts takes a great deal of trust. How does our stewardship reflect our trust in the Lord? What did we do today to give others hope in Christ Jesus?
