PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

In his 2022 Lenten message, Pope Francis reminds us that the season of Lent is a time for personal and communal renewal. It is an exercise in the virtues of patience and perseverance that prepares us for the joy of Easter. Quoting St. Paul's letter to the Galatians, the Holy Father speaks of Lent as an opportunity (Kairos) for "sowing goodness in view of the future harvest."

As you know, Lent 2022 is taking place during a special time of preparation for the 2023 Synod of Bishops whose theme is synodality itself: Communion, Preparation, and Mission. Pope Francis has asked Catholics throughout all regions of the world to commit to a threefold process of: 1) listening to God's Word and to one another; 2) encountering Jesus in prayer, reception of the sacraments, and service to others, especially those who are most in need of our help; and 3) discerning God's will for our Church. Lent is indeed an opportune time to practice synodality, to listen prayerfully, to encounter Jesus, and to discern God's will - if only we can 'seize the moment,' and allow the Holy Spirit to guide and empower us with his sevenfold gifts.

The Holy Father also tell us that "Lent invites us to conversion to a change of mindset, so that life's truth and beauty may be found not so much in possessing as in giving, not so much as in accumulating as in sowing and sharing goodness." This is the reason we pray, fast, and give alms during Lent - to renew our minds and our hearts so that we can rediscover the meaning of our life in the sowing and shar-

ing of goodness.

St. Paul writes in his letter to the Galatians, "let us never grow tired of doing good, for in due time we shall reap our harvest, if we do not give up. So then, while we have the opportunity, let us do good to all." (6:9-10). During Lent, fasting and abstinence are important as they are forms of spiritual discipline that prepare us for the foretaste of joy that we will experience at Easter when we celebrate Christ's resurrection and His decisive victory over sin and death. At the same time, "doing good" - active charity towards our neighbors - is also central to our observance of Lent.

Through patience and perseverance, we can overcome our reluctance and indifference and become zealous in our commitment to sowing and sharing goodness. With the guidance and the support of the Holy Spirit, we can make Lent, 2022 a blessed time and a "foretaste of the joy." May that Holy Spirit give us the courage, wisdom, and fortitude we require to persevere in avoiding evil and doing good, during the season of Lent and always.

Perseverance to Succeed: Guatemala

In some villages in Guatemala, malnutrition is high, which is especially dangerous for children. communities struggle with water scarcity, poor education, poverty, and a changing climate. Raul and Lilian Chanchavac live in the village of Xequemeya, where they grow tomatoes that were often destroyed by plant diseases. With help from a Catholic Relief Services program they received agricultural training, learned better ways to manage and care for their crops, and benefitted from nutrition education. The CRS training helped them expand their crops by adding onions, chili peppers and oranges. CRS helped them register with the government to begin selling their produce to local schools. This helped the school children and allowed them to provide jobs for their family and others in the community. Our sacrifices during this holy season have the power to change lives - deepening our faith and our connection to our one human family.

DIOCESE OF ROCHESTER PERMANENT DIACONATE

The deacon is a man of faith, who is called from the community that already recognizes his dedication to service. He makes a lifetime commitment to serving the People of God by proclaiming the Word, assisting and presiding at liturgies, and minister in the areas of charity and social justice. A deacon gives witness to his availability to the community by addressing present and emerging needs of the Church.

The diocese is inviting interested men of strong and active faith, who can demonstrate a record of service in the communities in which they live, work and worship, who may wish to explore a possible call to ordained ministry as a permanent deacon, to first speak with their pastor for an initial conversation. They may also contact Deacon Edward Giblin, Director of the Office of the Permanent Diaconate at Edward.giblin@dor.org for additional information. A potential candidate must be at least 35 years of age and no older than 62 years at the time of ordination after a five (5) year period of formation. He must be in good health, emotionally mature, have stable relationships and must have the wholehearted support of his wife (if married) and family to enter the phase of inquire. Because the parish is the primary experience of Church for most inquirers, the parish community is asked as well to invite from among its members men who exhibit strong faith and a spirit of service and encourage them to consider a possible vocation to a permanent diac-
