

A few years ago, Pope Francis proclaimed a Year of Mercy. In announcing this Year of Mercy, the Holy Father pointed to the person of Jesus, the miracles He worked, the relationships He formed, and the parables He taught. His mercy prompted Him to feed the hungry crowds; restore a son to his grieving mother; and speak of the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the welcome shown the prodigal son. In the parable of the servant who refused to imitate the master who forgave him debt, Jesus made it clear that mercy is an essential trait for all His followers. "Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?" (Matthew 18:33)

The season of Lent invites us to embrace disciplines of greater fasting, prayer and the giving of alms. It also is a time where we can be mindful of the importance of practicing the virtue of mercy. We often hear about both the Corporal Works and the Spiritual Works of Mercy. The Corporal Works of Mercy are found in the teachings of Jesus and give us a model for how we should treat each other, referred to as "the charitable actions by which we help our neighbors in their bodily needs. Next weekend our parish will join with parishes across the diocese and country to take up the annual Catholic Relief Services collection to provide funding for the U.S. Catholic community's global social ministries: Migration and Refugee Services, Catholic Legal Immigration Network, Secretariat for Cultural Diversity in the Church, Catholic Relief Services (CRS), USCCB Department of Justice, Peace and Human Development, and the Holy Father's Relief Fund.
