PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

It is my hope that you and your family enjoyed a very Blessed and Happy Easter! I was edified to see many of our people whom we have missed in recent months joining us for some of our Holy Week and Easter liturgies. Hopefully this is a sign of people feeling more comfortable in social and in-church gatherings.

A popular devotion of many people during the season of Lent is the praying of the Stations of the Cross, a prayer that invites us to focus on the way of the Cross, the last hours of Jesus prior to His crucifixion. The following is a reflection on the Station of the Cross authored by Father Peter Cameron, O.P., which uses the format of the Stations to reflect on the Resurrection and Mercy of God. I believe you will find these reflections quite insightful:

First Station: *Jesus rises from the Dead.* At your rising the peace, the forgiveness, the display of Your wounds are healing and mercy for me.

Second Station: The Disciples find the Empty Tomb. The emptiness inside of me is a crushing sore. The mercy of your empty tomb frees me and fills me.

Third Station: *Jesus appears to Mary of Magdala.* To a frantic Mary who wants to carry away Your body, you appear in Risen mercy to carry her away.

Fourth Station: Jesus walks with the disciples to Emmaus. To the two discouraged disciples, Your mercy appears as a sudden accompaniment. Walk with me!

Fifth Station: Jesus reveals Himself to us in the Breaking of the Bread. All that our heart craves abides in the Last Supper bread breaking. Break through my forgetfulness!

Sixth Station: *Jesus appears to the Disciples.* You appear in your humanity: eating, consoling, ridding fear. By your mercy, help me to be more human.

Seventh Station: Jesus confers on His Disciples the Power to Forgive Sins. You give, not the ability to live without sinning, but the power to forgive sin—the greatest mercy!

Eighth Station: *Jesus confirms Thomas in Faith. In your mercy, doubt will not gain the upper hand. Touching the wound in your hand reclaims us.*

Ninth Station: Jesus appears to His Disciples on the Shore of Lake Galilee. When we are adrift and dispirited, you come as a surprise, cooking us breakfast, calling us "children."

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE (continued)

Tenth Station: *Jesus confirms Primary of Peter.* The unity the Church needs you provide in the Successor of Peter, its visible source and foundation.

Eleventh Station: Jesus Entrusts His Disciples with the Universal Mission. I believe because of Christian witnesses who shared their faith. Make me a missionary of mercy!

Twelfth Station: *Jesus ascends into heaven.* You ascend in your humanity to heaven to give us access to the Father's house and to God's life.

Thirteenth Station: Mary and the Disciples await the Holy Spirit's Pentecost. Thank you for the Gift of the One who reminds us of all you said and who forms us in the life of prayer.

Fourteenth Station: Jesus sends the Spirit promised by the Father to His Disciples. Lost though we are in a state of deformity, the Holy Spirit restores our original beauty and fills with grace.

Have a great week and continue to enjoy these Easter days. Please continue to take care of yourself and each other!

REFLECTION — 2nd Sunday of Easter

Even Thomas struggles to remove his boulder! Being very pragmatic and determined, he wants to see the risen Christ for himself! Thomas's boulder is heavy with mistrust. Many of ours are too. A certain amount of skepticism is good, as it can save us from being duped or misled. But we can become so skeptical of things that it erodes our ability to trust anything we see or hear. Skepticism can actually be a well-disguised defense mechanism that we use to prevent us from being hurt or perceived as a fool. Having too much ego protection is a real risk. Thomas, because of the boulder blocking his vision, could not even trust the word of his friends.

Boulders are hard to move. It's difficult to seek change or take a risk, especially when we are so afraid to be vulnerable or reluctant to trust another's word. When we are closed minded, overly pragmatic, unwilling to see things in a different way, stubborn or defensive, it is difficult to be surprised by God. We need to be less guarded, selfassured, and self-absorbed. God cannot break into the ordinary moments of our lives and inspire us when we cling to doubt. If we are going to discover resurrection faith, we have to believe that what the witnesses say is true, especially when they are credible. We also have to trust that the risen Christ is alive in us, too!

While the first witnesses to the resurrection have faded into history, there are many others who have come after them. They continue to inspire by walking the talk of faith. They are the martyrs who offer their lives for the Gospel, the simple holy people in our communities who cling so steadfastly to their faith, those who have touched despair and found new hope and the ones who, even in spite of ridicule, still pursue their hunger and thirst for God. They are our friends, acquaintances, biblical heroes, and saints, and many others who are convinced that they have seen the Lord! The risen Christ may not surprise us with the same kind of visit as he did the first disciples, but God finds other ways. All we have to do is open our eyes, remove whatever is preventing us from seeing and believing and exclaim: "My Lord and my God!"
