

#### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

One of the marvelous traditions during the month of May is the May Crowning of Mary's statue in our church. This is done within the first Friday Mass, and involves members of each grade of our school, with the sixth grade students taking roles of leadership in the actual crowning of Mary. As I observed this year's crowning, I recalled an RCIA presentation I was giving some years ago, when the question was raised "Who is Mary?" My very short answer was "Mary was the Mother of Jesus." We know from scripture that Mary is that faithful, young woman who cooperated with God's plan, and gave birth to Jesus. Mary is mentioned quite often in the Gospel of Luke. Mary appears only a couple of times during Jesus' public life. For example, the marriage feast in Cana and again during Jesus' crucifixion, and lastly, she is found with the apostles on the day of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit is given to them.

In the tradition of the Catholic Church, Mary is understood to be much more than the Mother of Jesus. Because Jesus was both human and divine. Son of Man and Son of God, Mary became known as the "Mother of God" as well as the Mother of Jesus. This teaching about Mary became official in the fifth century. Secondly, because of Mary's pure birth, the Church taught that Mary was conceived without original sin, thus she was a worthy, sinless person from the very beginning of her life through who God could enter the world. This belief became an official teaching of the Church in 1854, though it was a commonly held belief by many for centuries. Third, because of Mary's devotion and faithfulness to Jesus throughout her life, the Church teaches that Mary was taken body and soul into heaven. This teaching is known as the Assumption of Mary, and solemnly declared so in 1950, again, having been held in the faith of the Church for many centuries. It was at the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), that Mary was declared as the "Mother of the Church." On a local historical note, it was in that year of 1965 that our parish's name and legal title was changed from "St. Mary Church, Horseheads, New York," to that of the "Church of St. Mary Our Mother, Horseheads, New York.

In the minds and hearts of Catholics in every generation, Mary has many other titles. Here are a few: Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Our Lady of Mercy, Our Lady of nations and peoples throughout the world. The new Catholic Cathedral in Los Angeles bears the name of our Lady of the Angels. If you tour the National Shrine

Devotional practices like the rosary, litanies to the Blessed Virgin Mary, and many prayers express our admiration and affection for Mary, call to mind her exemplary life of faith, express our needs, cares, and concerns, and asks for her intercession with her Son on our behalf.

There are many feast days throughout the Church's year of prayer to celebrate and honor the Blessed Mother. The month of May has been dedicated in a special way to pray to Mary and to reflecting on her life, her role in salvation history, and her compassion in understanding the joys and sorrows of our lives. Mary experienced many if not all joys and sorrows herself, and in her faith she is the model to all humanity in our faithfulness to her Son.


