

#### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

This is the time of year when many of our college students are graduating from various colleges and uni-We extend our congratulations and best wishes to all our college graduates. It is also a time when those who share leadership positions in the Church are celebrating anniversaries as well.

In the May issue of the Catholic Courier, many of the priests, deacons, and religious who are celebrating anniversaries were listed. Among them were a number of jubilarians with local ties to our area. Among those celebrating sixty years of priesthood are **Bishop Emer**itus Matthew H. Clark, who served as the ninth Bishop of Rochester from 1979 to 2012. Bishop Clark has taken up residence at the Sisters of St. Joseph Motherhouse. Also celebrating sixty years of priestly service are Father Robert C. Bradler, who served as pastor of both St. James and St. Thomas the Apostle, as well as Diocesan Director for the Propagation of the Faith for forty years; Father Eugene R. Weis, who served as pastor of St. Casimir Church, Elmira from 1987-1994. The ordination class of 1967 and observing fifty-five years of service has but one surviving member, Father Frank E. Lioi. Father Lioi currently serves as pastor of St. Mary Church, Saints Martha & Mary Church in Auburn, as well as pastor of the Northern Cayuga County cluster of parishes.

There are three priests who are observing fifty years of ordained service. Father Edward. Palumbos, Pastor Emeritus of the Church of the Assumption and the Church of the Resurrection, Fairport. Father Pius Pathmarajah, parochial vicar at St. Charles Borromeo Church, Greece, and a member of the Tribunal staff at the Pastoral Center. Father Louis A Vasile, pastor emeritus of St. Alphonsus Church, Auburn.

# EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP— RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS— "Up to the Job"

Have you ever had a job for which you didn't feel qualified? I think we all have, whether it was a paying gig or not. A lot of us parents often feel in awe of the magnitude of that role and lose sleep worrying that we made the wrong decision in one situation or a bad call in another. Some of us feel intimidated by what our communities need from us, on the parish level or in our personal relationships. Or maybe we are simply dreading a task that seems too big, too overwhelming — that necessary basement cleanout, or the weekly organization of family schedules.

When we don't feel qualified, we don't want to do the work. We get stuck in our own fear. That's the birthplace of procrastination, self-doubt and bitterness. When we look inward at our own abilities, we can only see all the traits that aren't there. The intelligence, the dexterity, the ambition — whatever it is we lack, we get stuck on it.

I've got good news and bad news. I'll start with the bad news: none of us are qualified for the call of discipleship. We simply aren't. We don't have the love or grace or strength to get the job done.

Now I'll give you the good news: God knows this, and He doesn't care. Stewardship does not insist that we possess every good quality — no, as a way of life, stewardship recognizes that we lack *so many* qualities. But it shows us where to find the love and grace and strength we need. Stewardship does not demand that we know every answer; it merely reminds us who to ask when we don't.


