

A reflection-continued:

A little thought experiment might be helpful here. Let's imagine that the doorbell rings this evening after dinner. We open the door and find Jesus standing there. He asks to come in. Are we ready for this honored guest? What will He find when He steps in unannounced? Is everyone at peace around the house? Is everyone speaking with love and acting with generosity? Is there anything in our home that, in His presence, we might be ashamed of—books, shows, movies, or music that aren't appropriate? Pictures, Facebook posts, or record of Internet history that we hope He won't discover?

Now, imagine that He came unannounced into our hearts this evening. What would He find there? Are our hearts ready to welcome Jesus? In truth, we need not wait for the second coming to have Jesus in our hearts. He wants to live there already today!

So regardless of the timing of the second coming of Christ, we would do well to follow the traditional spiritual practice of a daily examination of conscience to see where we are doing well and where we need to make changes. Taking such a deliberate spiritual inventory is an excellent way to help us be ready for Jesus like those servants: "who await their master's return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when He comes and knocks."

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

It's hard to believe that the first weekend in August is upon us! I hope that you are enjoying these summer weeks, and that your travels have been enjoyable. Wherever your travels take you, be sure to include Sunday worship. And in your travels, if you see any different local liturgical traditions or practices in the places you attend, I would love to hear about them. I do enjoy the fact that many of you pass on a Sunday bulletin to me from the parish you attended yesterday. travels.

As I write this column for the bulletin of August 6th, I realize that in just one month from today, September 7th to be exact, will be the first day of school for our students. (Not that I am wishing summer away!) While our children may be on their "summer break," and involved in many activities, our parents are not afforded such a luxury. I have found the following very wise advice for parents.

TEN COMMANDMENTS FOR PARENTS

- 1. I will always love and respect my children for who they are and not for who I want them to be
- 2. I will not burden my children with emotions and problems that they are not equipped to deal with, remembering that I am the parent and they are the children.
- 3. I will, when discipline is necessary, let my children know that I disapprove of what they have done, not who they are.
- 4. I will set limits for my children and help them find security in knowing what it is I expect from them.
- 5. I will make time for my children and cherish our moments together, realizing who is important-and how fleeting-they are.
- 6. I will create a loving home environment and show my children that they are loved, whenever and however I can.
- 7. I will be sure to give my children space-to grow, to dream, to succeed, and even to fail.
- 8. I will encourage my children to experience the world and all its possibilities, guiding them in its ways, and taking pains to leave them careful, but not fearful.
- 9. I will take care of myself physically and emotionally so that I can be there for my children when they need me.
- 10. I will try to be the kind of person I want my children to grow up to be—loving, fair minded, moral, giving, and hopeful.


