

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

An inward transformation occurs in a person who decides to follow Jesus Christ. Things change. They see the world differently, understand their journey more deeply and profoundly, have their sights fixed on eternity and union with God and hold themselves to higher standards and virtues. It requires a conscious choice to be a Christian, and this choice must be renewed at least daily. While the basic premise of Jesus' message may appear heartwarming and straightforward: love of God, neighbor, and self, the implications of doing so are challenging. The true disciple is called to live radically, and often finds themselves at odds with the world or even with those in their own homes. Holding ourselves to higher standards comes with a price. We have to leave other

things behind. It is difficult to be people of faith, hope, and love in a world often fixated with its own fulfillment and self-absorption. Justice, temperance, prudence, and fortitude require sacrifice if they are to be lived with integrity. God's ways are not ours. This becomes crystal clear to those who have enough courage to stand against the tide. Putting love into action requires that we challenge accepted modes of doing business and fight complacency. This is what makes the saints stand out as witnesses. They are simply sinners, just like us, who persevere.

People do not want to be told that they're sailing their ships in the wrong direction. Clinging to their insistence and need to be correct, they can become defensive when challenged. This can happen even with those closest to us. As much as the Gospel calls us to unity, it also can easily create division. When we love seriously, we encounter more than feelings of warmth and acceptance. "What does love look like? It has the hands to help others. It has the feet to hasten to the poor and needy. It has eyes to see misery and want. It has the ears to hear the sighs and sorrows of men. That is what love looks like (St. Augustine)." Love also has the courage and honesty to tell people what they may not want to hear but need to, and model, without wavering, a life of humble, loving, and faithful service. Don't lose heart! There are many examples of faith before us and around us. If Jesus endured the voices of opposition, so too can we. There is no need to apologize for speaking the truth.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

On Wednesday, August 3rd we learned of the passing of legendary sports broadcaster and voice of the Los Angeles Dodgers for sixty-seven years, Vin Scully, on Tuesday, August 2nd at his home in Hidden Hills, California, a suburb of Los Angeles. Vin was 94 years old.

Upon learning of Vin's passing, **Dodger President** and **CEO Stan Kasten** made the following statement: "We have lost an icon. Vin Scully was one of the greatest voices in all of sports. He was a giant of a man, not only as a broadcaster, but as a humanitarian. He loved people. He loved life. He loved baseball and the Dodgers., and he loved his family. His voice will always be heard and etched in all of our minds forever. I know he was looking forward to joining the love of his life, Sandi. Our thoughts and prayers go out to his family during this very difficult time. Vin will be truly missed.

Vincent Edward Scully was born in New York on November 29, 1927, a time when radio was new and television was an apparition of the future. He attended Fordham University, graduating in 1949. His first job in broadcasting was later that year, when CBS gave him an opportunity to broadcast a college football game on radio between, the University of Maryland and Boston University, at Boston's Fenway Park. Obviously, Vin made a very good impression on his superiors—one of which was a man named Red Barber, who at that time was the lead broadcaster for the then Brooklyn Dodgers. Red offered Vin a position as one of the team's broadcasters. Vin's first game was on April 18, 1950, that game turned out to be the first of over nine hundred baseball games that Vin broadcasted. He saw many "eras" of Dodger baseball through the years—From Jackie Robinson and Roy Campanella era of the 1950's; to Sandy Koufax and Don Drysdale in the 1960's; to the Steve Garvey and Ron Cey era of the 1970's, to the Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser in the 1980's, to the Eric Karros and Mike Piazza time during the 1990's, to the Andre Ethier and Matt Kemp time of the 2000's, to the Clayton Kershaw era of 2010 to the present.

I first met Vin during the summer of 1975, while completing a clinical pastoral education internship at St. Joseph Hospital and Medical Center, and Children's Hospital of Orange County in Orange, California. I have many wonderful memories of Vin these past 47 years; far too many to mention here.

But one of those memories was the honor of walking with Vin to his car in the stadium parking lot following games at Dodger Stadium.

A man of tremendous humility and grace, Vin would be the first to downplay his own abilities with words. Yet, he was without a doubt the greatest linguist ever to broadcast a sporting event. Vin was associated with many famous moments in baseball. When Henry Aaron hit his record-setting 715 career home run, which broke Babe Ruth's record, Vin stood quietly aside for nearly two minutes before saying:

Pastor's perspective continued:

"What a marvelous moment for baseball. What a marvelous moment for Atlanta and the state of Georgia. What a marvelous moment for the country and the world. A black man is getting a standing ovation in the Deep South for breaking a record of an all-time baseball idol. And it is a great moment for all of us and particularly for Henry Aaron."

Vin has received many awards, distinctions, and accolades down through the years. He was inducted into the broadcasters wing of the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown in 1982. He also has a star on the "Hollywood Walk of Fame, was named Sportscaster of the 20th Century, and received the Presidential medal of Freedom 2016. The address road that leads into Dodger Stadium, once known as 1000 Elysian Park Avenue, now goes by the name of 1000 Vin Scully Avenue. In 2017, the Dodgers inducted Vin into their Ring of Honor.

Vin was 88 years old when he finally "retired" as a Dodger broadcaster in 2016, having served as the "voice of the Dodgers" for sixty-seven years—a record of longevity that will never be broken.

As much recognition that Vin Scully received throughout his illustrious career, the role he cherished the most was being a husband, father, grandfather, and great grandfather to his

Vin was predeceased by his wife Sandi on January 3, 2021. He is survived by his children—Kevin, Todd, Erin, Kelly, and Catherine; twenty-one grandchildren and six great – grandchildren, and many, many friends throughout this country and the world. I consider it a great honor to have known Vin for 47 years and to consider him a close friend. Many accolades have been paid to "Mr. Scully"—oh, please don't call me Mr. Scully; call me Vin! Former Dodger and currently one of the Dodgers broadcasters recently said: "What this world needs are more Vin Scully's!" To which I say "Amen!"

I wish to thank so many of you for your telephone calls, e-mails, cards, letters, and notes of sympathy that I have received upon the passing of my good friend, Vin Scully.
