Everyday Stewardship continued.

The brother of the prodigal son had a lot of unexpressed desires. He sees his brother heaped with gifts and favors, feasting on the fattened calf, and he is enraged. *I haven't been given half of that*, he thinks, *and I've worked so hard*.

But for all his faithfulness, one has to wonder — did this son ever simply ask for what he needed? Did he get out of the car, so to speak, and ring the bell? Or did he sit in the driveway leaning on the horn?

God wants us to come before Him. He wants us to ask. He wants us to be like Moses — sure enough of our Father's indulgence to boldly ask for it. Think again about what you need but do not have, and ask yourself: Have I approached the door and rung the bell?

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

This past Tuesday, St. Mary Our Mother School opened its doors for the 64th consecutive year. St. Mary Our Mother School welcomed its first students in September, 1959, with an enrollment of 125 students in grades one, two, and three, with a faculty of six Sisters of St. Joseph. A few years later saw an expansion of the school building to twice its size due to the increasing numbers of students and expanded the number of grades to encompass students in grades kindergarten through eighth grade.

For the 2022-2023 school year, we have an enrollment of 152 students in grades pre-k through grade six. Though some of the policies and restrictions that had to be implemented during the Corona virus pandemic, we continue to follow governmental policies which will keep our students, faculty, and staff safe and healthy. Mrs. Heather Bill, our school principal and the entire school team have been working diligently to create and maintain a safe and welcoming environment at St. Mary Our Mother School. We are blessed with dedicated staff and proud of the commitment of each teacher, teaching assistant, and support staff has to ensure the academic success of every student.

Following are some comments I received when I asked individuals to share their memories of their grandparents.

My grandmother had family dinners often. It's not just about eating together, its about connecting with the ones you love the most. Because of this, my cousins are like brothers and sisters to me and my aunts are like second mothers.

My grandmother has encouraged me to reach goals I didn't believe I could reach. Because of grandma I have been successful in school, sports and life because of her support.

My maternal grandma talked to me, listened to me and took me to her house for overnight visits. I was 1 of 8 kids so the time alone with someone who loved me was so much fun.

My grandparents are the cutest couple in the world. They were and still are love birds. Their marriage was a love marriage when not many people dared to fall in love. Their love blossomed when she was just 18 and he was 28. They are still going strong.

My grandmother taught me how to count in Japanese by counting the number of train cars that would go by while we sat and waited to pick my uncle up from work.

My favorite memory is that every Sunday evening we would go to their house and have popcorn and milk, "delicious!".

My favorite memory is sitting on Busha's porch eating fresh paczki and talking to her as she brushed her cat, Fluffy.

My grandfather was a barber and I often spent my days at the shop with him; he wanted to teach me the trade. He was very religious. I remember, there were always rosery beads, visual candles, and statues around. My grandfather always wore a hat and without fail when out in public he would always tip his hat in respect as he passed a church or a woman.

Take time this week to remember your grandparents and think about how important and influential they were in your life. Be sure to offer a prayer for them.


