

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

Today we welcome **Father Aaron Kelly** to St. Mary Our Mother as he joins members of his family and friends as he presides and preaches today's 10:30 a.m. Mass. Father Kelly was ordained to the priesthood on July 2nd of this year, which makes him the most recently ordained priest for our diocese. Following Mass, there will be a reception for Father Kelly in O'Brien Hall. All are invited to attend.

Today is Catechetical Sunday, a day when we acknowledge and affirm the many dedicated people who serve as teachers and catechists in the various faith formation programs of our parish. This year's theme for Catechetical Sunday selected by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) is "This is my body given for you." Today is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the teaching role each of us plays in being a faith role model for others. Today is also a time to acknowledge and affirm all parents who are the first and best teachers of Catholic faith to their children.

Today I have asked our new Faith Formation Coordinator, **Amanda Reeves**, to offer her reflections and to offer you an update on the various faith formation programs offered at St. Mary Our Mother.

As catechists we work together as a community of disciples to share our faith with others. The word catechist comes from the Greek word "to echo." In order to echo God's word, we as catechists must possess certain characteristics and lead by example. God gave each one of our catechists gifts, and they have answered God's call to minister to the youth of our parish. According to the "Guide for Catechists," issued by the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples, there are six characteristics a catechist must have:

- 1. Openness to God
- 2. *Openness to the Church*
- 3. Openness to the world
- 4. Authenticity of life
- 5. Missionary zeal
- 6. Devotion to Mary

The catechists of Saint Mary Our Mother possess all these characteristics and more. As strong people of faith, these catechists have selflessly dedicated their time to share their faith with the youth of our parish.

I am excited we can continue to have in-person Religious Education classes that will be held on Tuesdays 3:45-5:00p.m. for grades K-6. We will continue to offer our Home Study program for parents who wish to take the responsibility of the catechist at home. Sacramental preparation will continue to be a hybrid model, with work being completed at home and meeting with a catechist in person. Please continue to check the bulletin for updates regarding Religious Education and Faith Formation.

I would like to thank those who graciously volunteer their time and talent serving the parish as catechists. Please join me in thanking Lily Barr for her administrative support. I thank Amy Barr, Meadow Barr, Karen Fracchia, Shirly Lant, Jean Oshetski, Tina Mitchell and Jacquelyn Shope for their time, talent, and dedication to the youth of our parish.

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

In Jesus' parable of the Unjust Steward, we encounter a financial manager who has wasted his master's wealth and faces dismissal from his position. To overcome the crisis confronting him, the steward reduces some very considerable debts owed by poor neighbors to his master in order to help them out. Though the steward has sinned against God and his master by squandering what belongs to someone else, both the prudent way in which he goes about resolving the crisis coupled with relieving people who are in need can be seen as a way to better steward the gifts entrusted to us by God. Although good stewards today acknowledge that they may never use their God-given gifts in a way that completely conforms to the demands of the Gospel, a commitment to using their gifts with prudence and for the purpose of helping their neighbors wins God's favor.



Catechetical Sunday: Sept. 18th, 2022 Why do we celebrate Catechetical Sunday?

The mission of the church reflects the mission of Jesus to teach, preach, heal, and forgive. Through these acts, Jesus shares the good news of salvation and invites all people to share in the life and love of God. The church continues this mission in all its ministries, but especially, and perhaps most importantly, through catechesis.

Catechetical Sunday is celebrated on the third Sunday of September. The task of handing on the Gospel is entrusted to the whole community, who by word and example, form young and new members in the way of the Gospel.

Parish programs assist parents in teaching the basics of faith through liturgical experience, instruction, and faith formation. This ministry is essential for the parish to grow, for individuals to develop as believers, and for the on going spiritual formation of the whole community. It reminds the church that preaching the Gospel and growing in faith are essential to our sacramental practice and our liturgical prayer.

This years slogan is "This is my body given for you". With these words from the Gospel, the Lord Jesus offers us the gift of Himself in the Eucharist. This theme reminds us that the object of all catechesis is Jesus Himself. The role of the Catechist is, first of all, to be a disciple and one who draws close to Jesus in the Eucharist, and then to be a witness to others and a companion as they too come to know Jesus and to encounter Him in the sacraments. May we who aspire to be effective catechists, have unwavering faith in the real presence of Christ, that we lead others by teaching and example to encounter Jesus with us at the Eucharistic table.


