#### **EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP**

In today's Gospel Jesus offers a warning about living self-ishly in his parable of the rich man and Lazarus. The rich man holds sumptuous feasts and dresses in fine clothes. But despite his affluence he does nothing to relieve the painful hunger and debilitating condition of his neighbor Lazarus. He neglects to love his neighbor as he loves himself and is sent to hell for his lifestyle and desire for self-gratification. The rich man represents those who spend their money on their own personal pleasures with no regard for sharing their material possessions with the poor and needy in their own neighborhood. Good stewards realize the practical implications of not only loving God, but loving their neighbor as they would love themselves. Who are the less fortunate in our neighborhood? Do we share a portion of our own blessings with them?

#### St. Jerome: Who is St. Jerome and why is he so significant that we honor him with a feast on September 30?

#### Answer:

St. Jerome (345–420) was considered the greatest biblical scholar of his day, conversant with Latin, Greek, and Hebrew. He set about translating the books of the Bible from their original languages into Latin.

Much of Jerome's correspondence has survived and gives us a powerful glimpse into the kind of person that he was, as well as the time in which he lived. Jerome eventually became Pope Damasus' (366–384) personal secretary. In the West, Latin was overtaking Greek as the language of the common people. The pope desired a translation of the Bible that would be accurately translated from the original languages into the language and idiom of the people. Previous Latin translations existed, but they were poor in quality.

Jerome set about this task and spent the rest of his life meticulously translating. He is credited with the translation of the Bible known as the Vulgate, a Latin translation intended to address the needs of the common people. That translation became the standard and the only one used by Catholics until modern times. Catholics did not actively engage in a similar process until 1943, when Pius XII allowed Catholic scholars once again to go back to the original languages and translate an accurate and meticulous version of the Bible. We carry on that tradition to this very day.

# CIVILIZE IT: A Better Kind of Politics...Elections 2022 and Beyond

Recent events point to the reality that we are experiencing a time of deep division in both Church and society. Pope Francis, in his encyclical, *Fratelli Tutti*, urges us to seek a better way. Key to the Pope's approach is a recognition that the ability to dialogue across perspectives is essential in order that social **love** can inspire new ways of approaching the problems of today's world, of renewing structures, social organizations, and legal systems. Civilize It: A Better Kind of Politics is an initiative of the U.S. Catholic Bishops that seeks to encourage Catholics to counter the polarization and division around us by following the example of the Good Samaritan-"become neighbors to all" (Fratelli Tutti, no. 80). Read, Fratelli Tutti (Vatican.va/content/Francesco/en/ encyclicals). Reflect: How can our parish community respond to Pope Francis' call to build "a better kind of politics, one truly at the service of the common good.
