

. Be Careful What You Wish For

You've probably heard the phrase "Be careful what you wish for." In my experience, it's not often utilized with a lot of charity. You usually hear it said as a warning. The unspoken sentiment behind it is this: *You're not as strong as you think you are.*

As Christians we shouldn't be surprised to look ourselves in the mirror and own that reality. We are not as strong as we may think. We are time and time again shocked and dismayed by our own weaknesses, our own fears, our own shortcomings.

Should we be careful what we wish for? The apostles asked Jesus to increase their faith, and He told them it would take work. It would take suffering. It would take patience. But He didn't say it was impossible.

As everyday stewards, we need to continue wishing recklessly. Ask God for anything and everything, come to Him with all your needs. Beg Him for grace without limit.

When we hear God's voice, it does not always say what we want to hear. But it always speaks the perfect truth. If it tells us of a hardship that we think we cannot bear, let us take solace in the knowledge that we are the stewards — not the landlord.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

For over forty years, there has been an annual campaign seeking financial support for the many ministries and outreach services of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Rochester, known as the Catholic Ministries Appeal.

The theme of this year's appeal is "I Am With You Always." The Catholic Ministries Appeal encourages us again to be supportive of the valuable ministries and services offered to our entire diocese. All registered parishioners should receive a letter concerning the CMA within the next week or two. I hope you will read this letter and prayerfully consider a gift to help us reach our financial obligation for this year's Catholic Ministries Appeal. Our parish goal for this year is \$95,000.00, which has been reduced from last year's goal of \$106,251.00. As you are aware, we are responsible for any shortfall to this year's

One question that is often asked each year concerning the Catholic Ministries Appeal is the question: "How are the goals for each parish determined for this appeal?" Good question! Each parish was recalculated on three factors: 2021 Mass Attendance, 2021 Parish Collections, and 2021 Household Median Income provide by the U.S. Census Bureau. These three factors factored in the reduction of our goal for this year's Catholic Ministries Appeal.

As the worldwide Church continues to emerge from the recent pandemic, the Catholic Ministries Appeal continues to help fund:

Enhancements to parish and institutional technology and internet networks to bolster cybersecurity and create efficiencies;

Implementation of cloud-based phone systems for parishes and Catholic Charities Agencies;

Consolidation of technology resulting from Catholic Charities agency mergers;

Seminarian and deacon education;

Support of the Synod process through the diocese, organizing listening and feedback sessions, providing consultation, and compiling results for on going work;

Sacramental ministry and outreach to diocesan Migrant Centers through the diocese, including the opening of the Tepeyac Welcoming Center in Leicester;




