

CIVILIZE IT: A Better Kind of Politics...Elections 2022 and Beyond (Part 3)

Pope Francis urges us (encyclical Fratelli Tutti) to recover the "sense of belonging to a single human Family", saying that, "we are all in the same boat." This is in stark contrast to the tendency, which has become commonplace, to disengage from difficult conversations and see only our own interests and perspectives. The Pope further challenges us: "Isolation and withdrawal into one's own interests are never the way to restore hope and bring about renewal. Instead of the inclination to be concerned only with myself, my group, my own petty interests, we have to commit to overcoming every individualistic mindset and instead seek the good of all people, including those we may see as different from us."

REFLECT: Am I genuinely ready to listen from the heart and see from others' perspectives in order to reach common ground in service to the common good?
