Hands of Christ Award 2023

The **Hands of Christ** is a recognition instrument to assist parishes in affirming high school seniors who have been the "Hands of Christ" in their church, home, school, and greater community. You are invited to nominate a high school senior from the class of 2023 for the Hands of Christ recognition.

A nominated high school senior must meet the following criteria:

- Consistently demonstrates a Christian attitude by word and example;
- Is actively involved in their parish as well as their school community;
- Is a positive role model for peers and younger children
- Is a participating member of St. Mary Our Mother. To nominate a senior, please stop at the parish office for a

registration form, complete the registration form, including the nominee's name, address, telephone number, and high school along with examples of the above mentioned criteria. All forms will be reviewed by Father Linsler as pastor. All nominations are due in the parish office by **November 15, 2022**.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

It is hard to believe that Tuesday of this week begins the month of November. November is a month when we are invited to "remember," beginning with All Saints Day, followed by All Souls Day on Wednesday. November 11th is Veteran's Day, a time to remember all our veterans who have served our nation so faithfully. Later this month we celebrate **Thanksgiving Day** which gives us an opportunity to gather with family and friends to offer thanks for all we have. November invites us to remember the past and live for the future, even as we live in these challenging times.

A popular song that our children often sing on All Saints Day is entitled "Sing a Song to the Saints." The song mentions a number of the more popular saints of our faith tradition by name, with a refrain inviting us to "sing a song to the saints." All Saints Day is a time to honor the women and men whose lives were marked with holiness of knowing, loving, and serving God throughout their earthly life. This day reminds us that holiness is a virtue for all of us—not just those who have been formally recognized to be so by the Church, but all who have loved God's call the best we can.

Every year on All Saints Day, I recall the occasions when the Litany of Saints is sung and prayed during the Liturgy. At the Easter Vigil, we are invited to sing this litany just before the elect are baptized. For those in Holy Orders, the singing of this litany brings back memories of their ordination. Before the bishop imposes hands on the candidate, he lies prostrate on the floor of the church, while the congregation joins the saints in the Kingdom, praying for the soon-to-be-ordained. This litany calls out for assistance and guidance, reminding us that we are not only part of the church here on earth, but a heavenly church as well.

Wednesday, November 2nd, we commemorate the Feast of All Souls. While not a day when we are obliged to attend Mass, this day invites us to pray for all the faithful departed. It is a day to remember deceased family members and friends. I often think of all of the former priests, religious, and family members who sacrificed to build our church and campus, who prayed, built community here, and truly loved the people. Think of the many funerals we have celebrated here. How often have we remembered and called upon our ancestors in faith to help guide and be with us in the most challenging times? All Souls Day invites us to remember and pray for our departed loved ones, sad that they are no longer with us, but happy that they are with God in heaven.

Veteran's Day is Friday, November 11th. This day reminds us that on the eleventh day of the eleventh month in the eleventh hour in 1918, the "war that was to end all wars," World War I ended in Europe. Every year since, we have paused as a nation to remember. We remember those who sacrificed their lives in all our nation's wars so that we might be a free nation. We remember war stories we have heard and continue to pray for peace. We are indebted to every military person who willingly put others ahead of themselves in offering the supreme sacrifice of their lives. Veteran's Day is a day to remember the past so that we don't repeat it!

CHRISTMAS CARING PROGRAM

Over the years, St. Mary Our Mother parish has reached out to help the needy of Horseheads and its many surrounding rural areas. We have done this in partnership with the Horseheads Food Pantry, which serves these families by providing food assistance. Parishioners have generously been supporting the pantry year-long by donating grocery items to the food cart and clean, empty deposit bottles and cans. Furthermore, 25% of the Rice Bowl proceeds that are returned by CRS are then given to help with the expenses of our local pantry.

As the Christmas season of giving and caring approaches, we, at St. Mary Our Mother, will be reaching out to the clients of the Food Pantry in **three** special ways.

- Making a monetary donation so the pantry can supply meat and fresh food for the Christmas meal and the holiday week. Envelopes will be provided for this purpose.
- Increasing our donations of canned and dried food to the vestibule food cart so the pantry clients have healthy and adequate food for the Christmas holidays.
- Bringing a Christmas ornament that you offer to a needy family. You will hang the ornament on our Christmas Caring Tree in the back of the church. The ornaments will be taken to the pantry so the families and children can pick an ornament for their tree as a reminder that we care for them.

This program will kick off on the weekend of November 19-20, when donation envelopes will be available in the vestibule and the Christmas Caring Tree will be standing proudly in the back of the church awaiting your ornaments. The program will conclude the weekend of December 10/11th.

The Social Ministry Committee invites and encourages all parishioners to participate in our Christmas Caring Program, in any one or more of the three ways listed above. So please be involved in spreading joy and showing love and concern for our neighbors in need.

Elections 2022 and Beyond

Once more, I appeal for a renewed appreciation of politics as a 'lofty vocation' and one of the highest forms of charity, inasmuch as it seeks the common good." (Pope Francis, Fratelli Tutti).
