

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

Wednesday of this week is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent. This season is a sacred time for all Christians, leading to the celebration of Easter. For those preparing to be received into full membership in the Church, it is a time of prayer and preparation for those sacraments. For those who regularly participate in the life of the Church, the season of Lent offers us an opportunity to embrace the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, so that we can recommit ourselves to living fully our baptismal promises which we will renew on Easter Sunday. For those who have been away from the Church for whatever reason, Lent is a time to reconsider renewing that relationship once again. I believe we all know people who have drifted away from the regular practice of their faith. Please offer a word of encouragement, invitation and welcome to our parish. Wherever you find yourself in your faith journey, please use the season of Lent as a time of spiritual growth and renewal.

Today's bulletin provides information on the Lenten opportunities available to you at St. Mary Our Mother, as well as a Lenten calendar for your use at home.

For the past years, we have offered publications for your use during the Lenten season. Two of these publications you should be familiar with. The first is "The Word Among Us," which offers a complete liturgical guide for the Lenten season, including scripture readings Mass texts, and meditations. The second publication is "The Little Black Book for Lent,", which offers creative and unique meditations for each day of Lent. These books are available today in the vestibule. There also is a children's edition of this book entitled "The Little Purple Book for Lent," which will be distributed to our children in our school and faith formation programs.

A traditional devotion offered in parishes during the Lenten season is the public praying of the Stations of the Cross, a devotion we could not offer in the past three years due to Covid-19 concerns. We will publicly pray this devotion each Friday at 5:15 p.m. in the chapel. Each Friday that St. Mary Our Mother School is in session, the school children will gather in the chapel at 1:30 p.m. for this devotion. St. Mary Our Mother School will present the "Living Stations of the Cross" in the church on Wednesday, March 29th, at 5:15 p.m.

As we begin this Lenten season, let us remember that we are called to reach out in love to our neighbor. Lent, as a season where we incorporate the disciplines of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, is also a time to reflect on how we can change and work toward loving others more readily. The ashes we will receive this Wednesday are an outward sign of our commitment of showing our love for others in all we say and do.

Have a great week and a good Lent. Please continue to take care of yourself and each other.

LENTEN REGULATIONS:

During Lent, the regulations for fast and abstinence: **Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent** are days

Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent are days of fasting and abstinence.

Good Friday is a day of **fasting**

All persons who are fourteen years of age or older are bound by the law of abstinence.

All persons between the ages of 18 and 59, inclusive, are bound by the law of fasting.

Catholics are especially encouraged to perform acts of penance during the season of Lent.

Abstinence—refrain from eating meat at all meals that day.

Fasting—only one full meal, the other two meals small enough that together they do not equal one full meal.

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and continues through to Holy Thursday, Good Friday has its own rule of fast and abstinence.

LENTEN REFLECTION:

What is the Catholic view of Lent?

This renewal of life as a disciple of Jesus is meant to prepare Christians for the fullness of life that is promised by the resurrection. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and lasts up to the Holy Triduum which are the three days leading into Easter.

The three main points of Lent.

As you've probably caught on by now, giving something up—or fasting—is only one of three things we should be focusing on throughout Lent. The other two, prayer and almsgiving, are very much about the "taking up" of things.

What is the reflection of the Lenten season?

Each year the Church gives us six weeks to take a long, loving look at our lives to see if our values and priorities are in line with God's desires for us. Since most of us find that we've wandered from God's path, Lent becomes that second chance, or do -over, to "return to God with our whole heart."?

Why is Lent meaningful?

As an important religious observance in the Christian world, Lent is the season to observe and commemorate the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, the son of God, our Savior and Redeemer. It is an opportune time to reflect on what it means to be a follower of Christ

How does Lent bring us closer to God?

It is a reminder of Christ's 40 days of temptation and fasting in the desert, and of Israel's 40 years of wandering in the desert. This penitential season of **fasting**, **alms-giving**, **and special prayer** is like a spiritual cleansing and renewal to draw closer to God.

What is your reflection about Lent?

Lent is a time to correct our bad habits and make ourselves a little bit more in Christ's image. Lent is also a time for sacrifice. During this season, we have the opportunity to sacrifice something that is meaningful to us.

Lenten Pray for the Comfort of God's Grace

Almighty God, grant that we who deserve to be afflicted for our evil deeds may mercifully be relieved by the comfort of your grace; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
