A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

In today's Gospel reading we listen to the confrontation between Jesus and the devil, who thought he might tempt Jesus to forget who He was and commit a grievous sin when He was most vulnerable. Jesus had just spent 40 days and nights out in the desert, alone, away from civilization. He was hungry, thirsty, and tired. If there ever was a time to tempt Jesus, that was it. Temptations to sin comes at us every day, from many directions and in many different forms. When the temptation to sin tries to overcome us, how do we react? Do we consciously remind ourselves that we are followers of Christ? Is there a time this week when you have needed to confront a temptation to sin? What lessons did you take away from the experience?

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

Today we welcome Deacon Kevin Carges to St. Mary Our Mother as our guest homilist. Deacon Carges is a Catholic Relief Services Global Fellow and will share his experience in visiting Catholic Relief Services project sites in Kenya, and how our Lenten sacrifices and almsgiving through Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl foster hope for the people of Kenya and around the world. We welcome Deacon Carges this weekend and look forward to this message on behalf of Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl.

The season of Lent is traditionally a time of **prayer**, **fasting**, and **almsgiving**. Christians from the earliest days of the Church have considered this period of time as a "Time of Enlightenment," a period of time to practice these three Lenten disciplines. But just what are these disciplines supposed to accomplish in us? To this day, it is common for people to tell us what they are doing for Lent, or what sacrifices people are making during the season of Lent, whether it is abstaining from dining in restaurants or abstaining from television, candy, alcohol, or desserts. You may also hear people mention spending less time with their Gameboys, Ipods, smart phones and the internet. But what is the reasoning behind these sacrifices people make during Lent? What are these penitential practices supposed to accomplish?

The Lenten practices we embrace during this season are meant to change our hearts. We journey through this Lenten season together as a church, although each of us has the freedom to choose our own Lenten practices. In changing individual hearts, we can change all hearts. The actions of any of us affect all of us, for good or ill. We involve ourselves in these Lenten practices to help not only ourselves but others in the discipline of Lent. We have an opportunity to grow closer to God and to change hearts. Lent is a season when we can remove anything that keeps us from being the person and the people God wants us to be. Anything that keeps us from growing closer to God and to one another is something we can work on as a part of our Lenten disciplines and penance. The Lenten season is a time when our prayer can help change and transform your life, in which your acts of penance can build up the community of faith.

The "official" fast days during the season of Lent are, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, but your personal fasting need not be restricted just to those two days of Lent. Personal fasting can be done any time. Once again this year, our parish will be participating in Catholic Relief Services /Rice Bowl, with all monies collected from these rice bowls being forwarded to Catholic Relief Services. This is an excellent practice in offering alms for the sake of others, and reminds us of the needs of the hungry throughout the world. On a local level, you may want to include a local charitable organization to be the recipient of your Lenten almsgiving. For those who have not yet given to the Catholic Ministries Appeal, you may want to make a gift to this annual appeal, and help our parish to reach our goal.

WE JOURNEY THROUGH LENT WITH CRS RICE BOWL: A Season For Slowing Down

During this sacred season, let us intentionally slow down so that we can pay attention to our relationship with God, our neighbors, and our planet. The Lenten Traditions of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving can guide our journey for a more enriching experience. In the coming weeks, the CRS Rice Bowl Stories of Hope will take us to Honduras, Kenya and the Philippines, where we'll learn how people are overcoming the causes of hunger and adapting to climate change with our help. As you journey with us during Lent, remember that through prayer God invites us to slow down and look for Him around us—in nature and in people who need us most. Our fasting is an act of solidarity with vulnerable people and it helps us feel a small part of what they are living day by day. It is in this spirit that our almsgiving is an act of love for God and neighbor.



EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

What is it that tempts you the most? Is it an action, a person, or a place? Is it something that seems innocent enough, like a food, a drink, or an event? When you really start reflecting, you find that there are many temptations all around. Even if you are strong and never succumb to a certain temptation, it is still there waiting for a weak moment in your life.

One difficultly in the life of a disciple trying to live a stewardship way of life lies in the temptations we never actually see. We are too busy thinking about past failures or successes, or we are fixated on what possibilities the future holds that we miss the important things going on in the present. Jesus could be standing directly in front of us, but we miss Him because we are looking everywhere except straight ahead.

Being mindful means that we are looking out for how and when God will call us this very day. Our decisions this day will have a huge impact on the future. If we only look to the future, we will miss those important calls to action. We may even find ourselves in a desert of sorts, looking for any way out we can find. However, God may need us to give of ourselves for a reason we cannot yet discern while in that desert. We need to stay awake, be aware, and look for His hand in all things. If we don't, we may even miss the pathway out of that desert when it presents itself.
