

PRAY, FASTING, ALMSGIVING:

When I was in parish work, I remember the parish priest talking with the school children about the topic of Lent and prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. He asked them if any of them knew what fasting was. After a very long wait, one student raised his hand and said, "It is what I do when my Mom is mad at me, I run really fast!" The adults in the assembly burst into laughter. Laughter is good.

However the Lenten devotions of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are very serious practices for us as we prepare to celebrate the Easter mysteries. As our catechumens and candidates prepare for the Easter sacraments, we are called by the Church to model what it means to be a Catholic Christian. We are called, especially during this Lenten season, to pray, fast, and give from the wealth we have to those who need our assistance.

This season is not merely a season of obligation to act more intently as God calls us to act; it is a season of opportunity to practice the foundation of our faith more attentively: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

I recently found the following article, which offers a creative insight on one of the disciplines of the season of Lent, the discipline of fasting.

Lenten Prayer: Fast from, Feast On

During Lent, let us...

Fast from criticism; feast on praise. Fast from self-pity; feast on joy.

Fast from ill-temper; feast on happiness. Fast from resentment; feast on contentment.

Fast from jealousy; feast on love. Fast from pride; feast on humility. Fast from selfishness; feast on service. Fast from fear: feast on truth.

Fast from judging others; feast from Christ within them. Fast from emphasis on difference; feast on the unity of life. Fast from apparent darkness; feast on the reality of light. Fast from thoughts of illness; feast on the healing power of God.

Fast from words that pollute; feast on phrases that purify. Fast from discontent; feast on gratitude. Fast from anger; feast on patience. Fast from pessimism; feast on optimism.

Fast from complaining; feast on appreciation. Fast from worry; feast on trust in God's care. Fast from unrelenting pressure; feast on unceasing prayer. Fast from facts that depress; feast on verities that uplift.

Fast from lethargy; feast on enthusiasm.

Fast from thoughts that weaken; feast on promises that in-

Fast from shadows of sorrow; feast on the sunlight of sincerity.

Fast from problems that overwhelm; feast on prayer that undergirds.

Fast from bitterness; feast on forgiveness. Fast from self-concern; feast on compassion for others. Fast from personal anxiety; feast on eternal truth. Fast from discouragements; feast on hope.



SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT THE TRANSFIGURATION

"When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid." Peter, James, and John already knew Jesus. They had been following Him, learning from Him, watching Him for quite some time. But what took place before their eyes at the Transfiguration was unlike anything they had yet witnessed. This was not just a miracle or a message, this was a supernatural vision. When Jesus' face suddenly "shone like the sun" and two ancient prophets appeared and spoke, and a heavenly voice announced the true identity of their friend and teacher, these three disciples nearly fainted in fear. It must have been too glorious, too strange, too astonishing to handle. But Jesus "came and touched them" to rouse them from their prostration. He told them, "Rise, and do not be afraid." What a beautiful moment. The Lord realized that His friends were overwhelmed. He had compassion on their meager ability to comprehend what was really going on. He allowed them to participate in this moment of revelation to help them understand who He was, but He still understood who THEY were, imperfect human beings who could not be expected to completely understand who He was, , imperfect human beings who could not be expected to completely understand the ways of God.

Sometimes we might long to witness a kind of Transfiguration moment. It can be tempting to think that if we had access to such a supernatural revelation, our faith would be strengthened and our lives would change.

But Jesus knows us best. He knows what we can handle and He knows the perfect way to reveal Himself. For most of us, most of the time, this means coming to know Jesus in the more ordinary ways of prayer, Scripture study, and the sacraments. Let's be sure we are ready to find Jesus there. LPi
