

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

Happy Mother's Day to all mothers in the parish of St. Mary Our Mother! We honor you today and offer our gratitude to God for you and the unconditional love you give to your children and to us. All Sunday Masses this weekend are being offered for all our mothers, living and deceased. With the public conversation today about the role of women in the church, in religious circles, and society in general, we should never fail to appreciate the uniquely womanly role of motherhood.

Like many others who have lost their mothers this past year, this will be the fifth Mother's Day without my mother for my family. We will remember her fondly throughout the day. I hope that if your mother is living, you can speak to her, tell her you love her, and spend some quality time with her. If your mother has passed to the Kingdom, I hope you are blessed with fond memories of her. If you are a person whose mother did not meet your needs or expectations, offer a prayer for her today, and pray for the healing of your memories, acceptance of what cannot be changed, and the decision to thank God for your life and the mother who gave you that life.

Each year, Mother's Day falls during the Easter season. As we experience signs of Easter life, this weekend invites us to center on "Mothers." One might say that a mother is the premier sign of Easter. She gives birth to human life to gain this title. Not only does she give birth, but she nurtures, encourages, cares, and loves her children. Motherhood is not a 9 to 5 job—nor is it concluded when her child walks out of the house. Motherhood is a life-long process—and, I believe, extends beyond the bounds of time and space to eternity. All that we envision in the life of a mother is envisioned in the life of an Easter person.

A survey was given to a number of mothers in which the participants were asked the question, "As a mother, what is most important to you?" The following are some responses:

The welfare of my children;

Our children's faith;

That my children become everything they are capable of being;

That my children somehow enrich humanity as peacemaker, reconciler, healer, and creative problem solver;

To ask God what I should say and do when my children are in trouble, to listen to God, and calm myself down before saying a word;

My children's failures are not my fault, and their successes are not my credit;

That girls can do and accomplish anything;

There can be hundreds of children being picked up from school; yet, when they hear their mother's voice, they know they are safe;

Pastor's perspective continued:

I thank God for letting me be my children's mom. I am grateful for biological mothers giving me these children to parent, praying that they know how much we love them:

That I do my best to prepare them for life—sharing love and joy, listening well, making peace, modeling the behavior I want to see in them, asking God for help, saying "I'm sorry," and "I love you,"—and show it;

That our children love God with their whole heart and love their neighbor as themselves;

To know that God loves them and that we love them too, unconditionally, as God does;

We hold our children in our hands for a little while and in our heart forever;

That their spouses are kind and loving, and I don't care if they make a lot of money;

That they have the same image I have of my own mother waving from the doorway when I am leaving; she is doing it now at the nursing home as her mother did before her.

I know that a mother always dies too soon;

My mother's dementia showed me that I had to be a mother's mother. This long good bye showed me our relationship is still there. When she actually died, it was as painful as if she'd died when she was young. She is very much alive to me right now. Maybe even more alive then when she died.

Happy Mother's Day to all our mothers! Have a great week. Please continue to take care of yourself and each other.


As he returned to his car, he overheard one of the workman say to the other, "I've been putting in septic tanks for twenty years and I've not ever seen anything like that."
