

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

One of the marvelous traditions during the month of May that we have is the annual May Crowning of Mary. This is done within the First Friday Mass, and involves members of each grade of our school, with the sixth grade students taking roles of leadership in the actual crowning of Mary. As I observed this year's crowning, I recalled an RCIA presentation I was giving some years ago, when the question was raised "Who is Mary?" My very short answer was "Mary was the mother of Jesus." We know from scripture that Mary is that faithful, young woman who cooperated with God's plan, and gave birth to Jesus. Mary is mentioned quite often in the Gospel of Luke. Mary appears only a couple of times during Jesus' public life, fore example the marriage feast in Cana, and again during Jesus' crucifixion. Lastly, she is found with the apostles on the day of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit is given to them.

In the tradition of the Catholic Church, Mary is understood to be much more than the mother of Jesus. Because Jesus was both human and divine, Son of Man and Son of God, Mary became known as the "Mother of God" as well as the Mother of Jesus. This teaching about Mary became official in the fifth century. Secondly, because of Mary's pure birth, the Church taught that Mary was conceived without original sin; thus she was a worthy, sinless person from the very beginning of her life through whom God could enter the world. The belief became an official teaching of the Church in 1854, though it was a commonly held belief by many for centuries. Third, because Mary's devotion and faithfulness to Jesus throughout her life, the Church teaches that Mary was taken body and soul into heaven. This teaching is known as the Assumption of Mary, and solemnly declared so in 1950, again, having been held in the faith of the Church for many centuries. It was the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), that Mary was declared as the "Mother of the Church." On a local historical note, it was in that year of 1965 that our parish's name and legal title was changed from "St. Mary Church, Horseheads, New York," to that of the "Church of St. Mary Our Mother, Horseheads, New York.

In the minds and hearts of Catholics in every generation, Mary has many other titles. Here are a few: Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Our Lady of Mercy, Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Our Lady of Guadalupue, etc. Mary has become associated with many nations and peoples throughout the world. The new Catholic Cathedral in Los Angeles bears the name of Our Lady of the Angels. If you tour the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C., you will find our Lady of Sweden, Our Lady of Cuba, Our Lady Queen of Africa, and many other depictions of Mary, each looking like the people of each land. Devotional practices like the rosary, litanies to the Blessed Virgin Mary, and many prayers express our admiration and affection for Mary, call to mind her exemplary life of faith, expresses our needs, cares, and concern, and asks for her intercession with her Son on our behalf.

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS FUNDING—GOOD NEWS IN THE NEW YORK STATE BUDGET:

The recently enacted New York State budget includes significant victories for Catholic schools.

The New York Legislature increased spending on STEM for Catholic and other schools by \$15 million dollars (26 percent) for a total of \$73 million dollars, added \$1.9 million dollars to help ensure funding is sufficient to fully reimburse our schools for the Mandated Services; and allocated \$1 million dollars for the immunization program. The STEM founding will go a long way toward helping our Catholic schools prepare our students for careers.

ON THE LIGHTER SIDE:




" I was just fine with the concept of sharing my faith until Pastor said we actually had to talk to people."
