

#### **ROLE OF CATHOLICS IN SOCIETY:**

#### **Question:**

We live in a country that upholds the separation of Church and state. What is the role of Catholics in society?

#### Answer:

The role of the Church in the world has taken different forms over time, but the theme is the same. Be disciples in it! As the lay faithful — that is, not vowed priest or religious — we are called to live and love in the circumstances of our daily lives. St. John Paul II wrote a document about the laity. In it he wrote, "In their situation in the world God manifests His plan and communicates to them their particular vocation of seeking the Kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and by ordering them according to the plan of God" (On the Lay Members of Christ's Faithful, 15).

God wants us in the hospitals, the board rooms, the law offices, the food pantries, and the little league games! We are to engage in the affairs of the world. But when we are there, we should live the plan of God. We need to respect those around us, engage in just business and legal practices, and love our children. We should care for the earth, use our money wisely, and get to know our neighbors. We must advocate for social policies that respect human dignity and human freedom. No matter our state in life, we are invited to build the kingdom of God!

#### **PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:**

Due to the Memorial Day weekend and an early bulletin deadline, I am writing this column on May 19th. As of today, we are looking forward to the Pentecost Sunday, the Memorial holiday weekend, as well as the beginning of the month of June. By the time you read this, the holiday weekend and the month of May will be history, we will have concluded the Easter season, liturgically we will have returned to Ordinary Time, and the month of June will be upon us!

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast celebrates our belief that God is a "triune" of persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In faith, we believe these persons are distinct from each other and united as one God; they are equal and eternal. We know about the nature of God only because God has revealed it to us. Even though it has been revealed, it is still a mystery beyond our understanding. Today's feast celebrates the fact that our triune God loves us and has invited us into the relationship shared by God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. This Trinitarian greeting is often spoken by the priest presider as we begin the celebration of the Eucharist when he says, "*The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.*"

The month of June always marks a "winding down" of many of our normal parish activities that occupy our attention for most of the year. This month is also a time when our schools and students are readying themselves for final examinations, graduations, and summer school recess. I would like to give you an update on some "statistics" concerning Saint Mary Our Mother School. As of May 19<sup>th</sup>, our current enrollment is 146 students, with a projected enrollment for 2023-2024 of 168 students. We will say "farewell" to 9 of our sixth-grade students at their **Sixth Grade Celebration on Wednesday, June 21<sup>st</sup> at 6:30 p.m.** 

People often pose the question: **"Why do families choose to send their children to a Catholic School?"** The following are some random answers:

*I believe Catholic Schools educate the whole personmind, body, and spirit.*

We Bear the Name of the Lord

The name of the Lord is a curiously powerful thing. Say it deliberately, even in a group of people who are not particularly religious, and you'll know what I mean. There is a shift in the mood, a change in the atmosphere. When we utter the name of the Lord, He turns His head.

Once, in confession, I admitted to the sin of using the Lord's name in vain. "When you do that, tell God that you love him," advised the priest, who was wise enough to know that I would repeat this sin at some point. "You've said His name, after all. You have His attention."

We hear the name of the Lord, and we think of what it represents — John 3:16, salvation history summed up in a neat little sentence, the why and the how and the who of it all laid out before us. The Lord, so slow to anger that He offers us a million chances. The Lord, so rich in kindness and fidelity that He literally gave Himself to us that we might be saved.

But the name of the Lord is more than that. It is not just a symbol, it is an invitation. I think of Moses clutching the commandments, beseeching the Lord: "Come with us. For-give us. Receive us as your own." The Lord accompanies us down the mountain. We bear the name of the Lord into the world with us wherever we go.

I have to ask myself: do I do that name justice?

#### CATHOLIC SCHOOLS FUNDING—GOOD NEWS IN THE NEW YORK STATE BUDGET:

The recently enacted New York State budget includes significant victories for Catholic schools.

The New York Legislature increased spending on STEM for Catholic and other schools by \$15 million dollars (26 percent) for a total of \$73 million dollars, added \$1.9 million dollars to help ensure funding is sufficient to fully reimburse our schools for the Mandated Services; and allocated \$1 million dollars for the immunization program.
