

#### A STEWRADSHIP MOMENT

St. Joseph is one of the greatest examples of stewardship we have in the Gospels. Here is a man who understands care and reverence for the property of God, a man chosen to be steward over the very life and breath of God's Son and Spouse.

Joseph was mindful. He recognized what belonged to God. When he understood that Mary was to be the mother of God, he was not jealous or bitter. He did not presume to claim ownership over her.

Joseph was prayerful. He accepted the opportunity to be in relationship with God, even if it was in a radical and unexpected way. How many of us would trust a crazy dream we have where an angel tells us our fiancée is carrying the Son of God? Well, those of us who are already profoundly connected to God through prayer. Joseph was open to receiving God, and so he was open to the truth in a way many of us would not have been. Joseph was gracious. Even before he had full understanding of the situation, he was unwilling to expose Mary to shame. He did not give himself over to feelings of betrayal. *Continued on page 4* 

#### **PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:**

This is the time of year when many of our college students are graduating from various colleges and universities. We extend our congratulations and best wishes to all our college graduates! It is also a time when those who serve in leadership positions in the Church are celebrating anniversaries of their service to the people of God.

In the May issue of the *Catholic Courier*, many priests, deacons, and religious who are celebrating milestones were listed. Monsignor Gerard Krieg, the former pastor of St. Stephen Church in Geneva is celebrating 70 years of ordained service. Father F. James Lawlor, who served as pastor of St. Mary Church in Rochester, and St. Catherine of Siena Church, Mendon is observing 60 years of service. Four diocesan priests are observing 55 years of service, two have local connections to our area. Among them are Fathers Richard and Robert Beligotti, originally from Watkins Glen. Father Richard Beligotti served as pastor of St. Charles Borromeo parish in Elmira Heights from 1989-1994, as well as an associate pastor at St. Mary Our Mother in 1981. Father Robert Beligotti's first priestly assignment was at St. Charles Borromeo Church in Elmira Heights, and later served at St. Mary Church, Elmira. Father Charles Latus is the pastor emeritus of St. Rita parish in Webster and served as Priest Secretary to our late Bishop Matthew H. Clark. Father James Schwartz, the final member of the Ordination Class of 1968 currently serves as pastor of Holy Spirit parish and St. Joseph parish, both in Penfield.

Those priests marking 50 years of service are **Father Joseph A. Hart,** former Vicar General of our diocese, and currently pastor of Our Lady Queen of Peace and St. Thomas More parishes in Rochester, **and Father Francis Jones, C.Ss.R.,** on the staff of the Notre Dame Retreat House in Canandaigua.

The ordination year of 1978, of which I am a member, is observing 45 years of service. This class includes **Father John A. DeSocio**, an Elmira native and pastor emeritus of St. Mary Church, Elmira. **Father Robert J. Schrader**, pastor emeritus of Peace of Christ parish, Rochester (a parish cluster of three churches, St. Ambrose, St. James, and St. John the Evangelist.) **Father John F. Gagnier**, parochial administrator of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parish in Hamlin, who later this month will become the parochial administrator of Holy Cross, **Dryden**, **St. Anthony**, Groton, and All Saints in Lansing. **Father Leo J. Reinhardt**, pastor of Our Lady of the Lakes, Penn Yan.

Two of our diocesan priests are celebrating 40 years of ordained service. **Father Robert J. Bourcy** is currently serving as pastor of St. Catherine of Siena, Menden and the Church of the Transfiguration, Pittsford. Father Patrick L. Connor, served here at St. Mary Our Mother from 1989 to 1992, is currently the pastor of St. Isidore & Maria Torribia parish in Addison.

# Care for God's Creation—Plastic/Packaging Waste Reduction Legislation in New York State:

BACKGROUND: The New York State Legislature is considering legislation to reduce plastic waste by 50% over twelve years. The Packaging Reduction and Recycling Infrastructure Act (A.5322 S.4246) would require companies selling, offering for sale, or distributing, cover packaging materials and products, to reduce consumer packaging, improve recycling and recycling infrastructure, including supporting reusable and refill infrastructure, financially support municipal recycling programs, reduce toxins in packaging and require producers of products to bear the responsibility for end of life solutions to product packaging. Pope Francis mentions this idea of circular production where resources are reused/repurposed rather than simply discarded (Laudato Si).

Discarded plastic and other packaging is clogging landfills and no one knows how much plastic and other packaging waste ends up in the oceans threatening ocean ecosystems. If plastic had been invented when the Pilgrims sailed from England, and the Mayflower had been stocked with plastic wrapped snacks etc., their plastic trash would likely still be around now, four centuries later.

ACTION NEEDED: Please encourage our NYS Legislators to pass this bill before they adjourn for the summer. Assembly Speaker Carl Heastie and Senate Majority Leader Andrea Stewart-Cousins are supporting passage. 
#### **FUNNY THINGS KIDS SAY:**
