A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT: 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time:

ANNUAL BACK TO SCHOOL PROJECT: Help Local Kids Get Ready For The School Year!

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

Two years ago, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops announced that **Pope Francis-I** has instituted a Churchwide celebration of a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly to honor and celebrate the contributions of grandparents and the elderly to our families and society. This day is to be celebrated each year on the fourth Sunday of July, the Sunday closest to the liturgical memorial of Saint Joachim and Saint Anne on July 26th. We will celebrate this first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly at our Masses this weekend. The Holy Father instituted this day, which is long overdue in the opinion of many because "grandparents are often forgotten and we lose this wealth of preserving roots and passing on what the elderly have received." The Holy Father further emphasized the importance of grandparents and grandchildren getting to know one another, spending quality time together, and sharing stories. Though this is short notice, and if your grandparents are still living, plan to honor them in some way on the first World Day of Prayer for Grandparents and the Elderly. If they have passed to the Kingdom, remember them in prayer today.

Now a "Did you know" question! Did you know that Saint Joachim and Saint Anne were the Blessed Virgin Mary's parents and Jesus's grandparents? Saints Anne and Joachim, like Abraham and Sarah of the Old Testament, were scorned because they had no children. Years of longing did not weaken their trust in God, but grief eventually drove Saint Joachim into the wilderness to fast and pray. Saint Anne, remaining a home, went to a garden to plead with God for a child. Angels appeared to Saint Anne in her Garden and Saint Joachim in the desert, promising that, despite their old age, they would give birth to a child who would be known throughout the world. Legend has it that the parents ran to meet one another at Jerusalem's Golden get, and rejoiced in the new life which has had been promised would be theirs. Saint Anne and Joachim are powerful intercessors for all married couples, expectant parents, married couples who are having difficulty conceiving, and those who have entered their senior years.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Patience is rooted in Hope (an image of a bush filled with birds would be great).

Life, like the church, is often burdened with evil, smallness, and impurities. The Lord's parables give us a hope-filled perspective on all three.

Evil: In Jesus' parable about the good farmer whose enemy plants weeds at night, Jesus tells us that God is not the cause of evil but permits evil to exist with good out of His patient love. He *will* finally deal with it, but his love lets things stay messy for a time.

Smallness: It's funny that Jesus says His kingdom looks like ... wait for it ... a bush. What a letdown! Yet this little shrub still somehow has room for all the birds of the sky. The smallness of the Church, and even our own little lives, still provides plenty of room for all whom God sends.

Impurities: Divisions and hypocrisies in the Church and our own hearts exasperate us. Recall that Jesus compares His kingdom to a lump of dough with impure leaven eating away at it and therefore making it expand. It's the secret of the Cross. Not how we'd prefer it. But finally, great news.

The field, the bush, the loaf: all three parables invite us to embrace a patience rooted in hope: one day the field will be weeded, the bush filled with birds, and the risen loaf leaven-free.

Saint Anne and Saint Joachim-Grandparents of Jesus:

In the Scriptures, Matthew and Luke furnish a legal family history of Jesus, tracing ancestry to show that Jesus is the culmination of great promises. Not only is His mother's family neglected, we also know nothing factual about them except that they existed. Even the names "Joachim" and Anne" come from a legendary source written more than a century after Jesus died.

The heroism and holiness of these people however, is inferred from the whole family atmosphere around Mary in the Scriptures. We see Mary as a fulfillment of many generations of prayerful persons, herself steeped in the religious traditions of her people

The strong character of Mary in making decisions, her continuous practice of prayer, her devotion to the laws of her faith, her steadiness at moments of crisis, and her devotion to her relatives—all indicate a close-knit loving family that looked forward to the next generation even while retaining the best of the past.


Joachim and Anne—whether these are their real names or not—represent that entire quiet series of generations who faithfully perform their duties, practice their faith, and establish an atmosphere for the coming of the Messiah, but remain obscure.

This Sunday we celebrate the "feast of grandparents." It reminds grandparents of their responsibility to establish a tone for generations to come: They make the traditions live and offer them as a promise to little children. But the feast has a message for the younger generation as well. It reminds the young that older people's greater perspective, depth of experience, and appreciation of life's profound rhythms are all part of a wisdom not to be taken lightly or ignored.
