A STEWARDSIP MOMENT:

Today's Gospel reveals what miraculous things can happen when one embraces a single-minded faith in Jesus Christ. Peter gets out of the wind-tossed boat when the Lord calls him. His faith is tested by his obedience to Jesus who is calling him out onto the water. In the midst of the waves and the wind Peter gets out of the boat and walks toward Jesus. PASTORS PERSPECTIVE:

Tuesday of this week is the **Solemnity** of the **Assumption** of the **Blessed Virgin Mary.** It is a holy day of obligation, or in another sense, a holyday of "opportunity". The regional Mass schedule for the holyday is printed on page 2 of this bulletin. This solemn feast celebrates Mary being assumed into heaven, body and spirit, at the end of her earthly life.

The early Christian communities never thought of Mary without reflecting on her relationship with her Son, Jesus. In the gospel of St. Luke, Mary is portrayed as the "prototype" of the Church, the perfect Christian, the perfect disciple. With her assumption, St. Luke depicts Mary as a person who constantly does what Jesus expects all of His followers to do, to "*hear God's word and carry it out.*"

We believe that the Assumption of Mary was the end of her earthly life as a disciple. Mary's life of discipleship began long before she was born, namely with the Immaculate Conception, and it continued through her earthly life when she agreed to accept God's invitation to become the mother of Jesus. God always initiates and offers, and Mary accepted God's invitation. We join Elizabeth in rejoicing over Mary's saying "Yes" to God: "Blessed are you, Mary, who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." Notice how Mary always defers all praise to God: "My soul proclaims that greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God, my savior." In addition, Mary reminds us that God "has lifted up the lowly." We believe that Mary's Assumption was God lifting up Mary to eternal life with Christ. When the Assumption of Mary into heaven is viewed as the final chapter of her earthly discipleship, the feast is rich in meaning. As members of the Church and as the people of God, we are all called to be followers of Christ.

Being the Good News and bringing the Good News of God's love for others is what God asked of the Blessed Virgin Mary. God asks the same of us. When we love and serve others, we can be confident that God's response of resurrection and eternal life will be given to us. St. Paul mentions in today's second reading the fact that *"in Christ shall all be brought to life."* On the Feast of the Assumption of Mary, we give thanks and praise to God that Mary is among those first brought to life in Christ. At the same time, we express our hope that the same destiny of resurrection awaits us at the conclusion of our earthly journey.

God has accomplished great things through the life of Mary, and continues to do great things for us. May we join Mary, our Mother, in proclaiming the goodness and greatness of our God, who will raise all people to fullness of life in Christ.

THE ASSUMPTION: A SIGN OF HOPE:

Is the resurrection a concept or reality? For many of us, the resurrection of the dead may be a stray idea recited in the Nicene Creed. Heaven, we discuss. But resurrection? The Feast of the Assumption is a reminder to us that heaven gets even better! We pray that the souls of the faithful departed would soon be united to God in heaven. The truth is, the separation between our souls and our bodies was not God's original plan for things. It's one of the results of the Fall, of original sin. At the end of time and Jesus' second coming, our bodies and souls will be reunited. Lest we forget, Mary's Assumption is the reminder. In the celebration of the Assumption, we celebrate that Mary is enjoying what we, too, hope to participate in — complete joy in heaven with our God, experienced body and soul. Today and every day, let's pray for those who have died and that we may meet them again in the heavenly kingdom.

ANNUAL BACK TO SCHOOL PROJECT:

Each year our parish partners with Catholic Charities to collect school supplies to help parents send their children back to school, ready to learn with the supplies they need. This year backpacks with supplies will be distributed to about 700 Chemung County students during the Strong Kids, Safe Kids (August 26th) event.
