

A SACRAMENTAL SEAL AND WHERE IT COMES FROM:

Leaving more than just a memory, there are some events in our life that are truly transforming making us different people. The same thing can be said of spiritual things, especially sacraments. A sacramental seal or character is a theological concept to describe the life-changing and permanent effect of three sacraments on the person; Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that these sacraments confer a seal "by which the Christian shares in Christ's priesthood and is made a member of the Church according to different states and functions. This configuration to Christ and the Church, brought about by the Spirit, is indelible" (#11221).

Once we receive these sacraments, we are forever changed. It's a spiritual "point of no return" whereby we take a step forward in our faith journey. We are marked as people of faith, as those who have received the Spirit, and as those called to serve in ordained ministry. That is why these sacraments are received only once. The direction is set, the choice is made, and we are called by God to be His people. Nothing can change that, not even our own sinfulness.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

The following is the second of a series of articles from the August 2023 newsletter from the International Catholic Stewardship Conference, taken from the 2018 book Stewardship: A Life-Giving Spirituality, authored by **Reverend Joseph D. Creedon**. The article coincides for us as the American church observes these days of Eucharistic renewal.

I firmly believe that the spirituality of Stewardship is the best solution to the declining Sunday Mass attendance. Eucharist means thanksgiving and the first step on the road to becoming a good steward is "to receive God's gifts gratefully." If we have an "attitude of gratitude" in our lives and in the lives of the people we love then we will be on the road to recovery. Once we rediscover that "everything we have is a gift from God," then we will be forever vigilant in our search for the ways we thank God for all that He has given us.

There is no better way to thank God than to gather with our fellow believers, admit our sinfulness, give glory to God, open our minds and hearts to the Word of God proclaimed, offer our gifts, pray together for those gifts to be transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ, receive communion and then be sent forth to a waiting world with the message that God gives us the gift of His love.

The Second Vatican Council, in the decree on the Liturgy, reminds us "liturgy is the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed; at the same time it is the fountain from which all her power flows." (#10) It has been 50 years since the Council issued its first teaching on the liturgy. Much has been done to restore liturgy to its central role in the life of the Church. More remains to be done until the vision of "full, active, conscious" participation in the Mass becomes the norm rather than the exception.

It is impossible to actively join in the celebration of the Mass and not have our hearts filled with gratitude. Whenever we gather to celebrate the Mass, we come to give thanks to God for all His gifts and a miracle happens. We come to give thanks, we receive more gifts and we go forth with even more for which to be thankful.

Perhaps the best way to explore the miracle, the mystery of the Eucharist, is to take part in an extended meditation of just what happens when we gather to break bread as the People of God.

U.S. FARM BILL 2023

Every five years the U.S. Congress authorizes the national farm bill that covers a variety of domestic and international food and agricultural programs. While most of the Farm Bill funding covers programs in the U.S. (like crop insurance, forestry and conservation programs, rural development, SNAP food, etc.) a small amount funds international food and development assistance. The International programs include Food for Peace, Food for Progress, McGovern-Dole Food for Education, and the Farmer to Farmer Program. Catholic Relief Services is especially concerned that the Congress reauthorize and expand the flexibility and efficiency of these lifesaving international programs that work toward ending hunger and building self -sufficiency for the world's most vulnerable people. Pope Francis teaches us that sooner or later, we will all encounter a person who is suffering. Today there are more and more of them. Each day we must decide whether to be Good Samaritans or indifferent bystanders. Our faith calls us to care.


