PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

This past Tuesday, St. Mary Our Mother School opened its doors for the 65th consecutive year. St. Mary Our Mother School welcomed its first students in September, 1959, with an enrollment of 125 students in grades one, two, and three, and with a faculty of six Sisters of St. Joseph. A few years later, due to an unprecedented population growth in Horseheads and Chemung County, the school saw an expansion of the school building to twice its size, expanding the number of grades to encompass kindergarten through eighth grade.

For the 2023-2024 school year we have an enrollment of 178 students in grades Pre-k through grade six.

Although many of the policies and restrictions that had to be implemented the past few years as a result of the pandemic have been relaxed, we continue to follow all safety policies which will keep our students, faculty, and staff safe and healthy. **Mrs. Heather Bill**, our school principal, and the entire school team have been working diligently to create and maintain a safe and welcoming environment at St. Mary Our Mother School. We are blessed with a dedicated staff and proud of the commitment of each teacher, teaching assistant, and support staff member has to ensure the academic success of every student.

U.S. Farm Bill 2-23– Reflection :

Every five years the U.S. Congress authorizes the national farm bill that funds a variety of domestic and international food and agricultural programs for the next five years. Most of the Farm Bill funding covers programs in the U.S. (like crop insurance, forestry and conservation, rural development, SNAP etc.). A small amount funds international food and development assistance. Farm Bill programs put food into the hands of hungry people and support family farmers. For U.S. farmers and ranchers, the Farm Bill's safety net programs are essential to making sure that family farms stay afloat when there are severe market downturns due to natural disasters. Pope Francis teaches: The Parable of the Good Samaritan eloquently presents the basic decision that we need to make in order to rebuild our wounded world. In the face of so much pain and suffering, our only course is to imitate the Good Samaritan (encyclical Fratelli Tutti). Please contact our Congressman Nick Langworthy at langworthy.house.gov, or a 607-377-3130. Ask him to increase funding for agricultural research, including a focus on helping farmers build resilience to a changing climate; ensuring robust funding that family farmers need for conservation to adapt to a changing climate; and improving access to farmland, credit, markets, and technical assistance.
