## A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT: Twenty-eight Sunday in Ordinary Time:

There are a number of Bible verses Christians have memorized. One of them is in St. Paul's letter to the Pilippians found in this weekend's second reading: "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." (Phi. 4:13). Most people define themselves either by their problems or their possibilities. Fearful people wake up each morning ensnared by their problems. Christian stewards wake up reflecting on their possibilities with confidence and hope. Some stewardship reflection questions for the week:

What challenges do you back away from because you doubt you are up to them?

What would you attempt tomorrow if you were sure God would help you?

Pope Francis invites the entire Church to support mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands, parts of Latin America and parts of Europe, where priests, religious and lay leaders serve the world's most vulnerable communities. #### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

Due to an early bulletin deadline, I am writing this column on Monday, October 2nd, in anticipation of the Columbus Day holiday weekend. We are also anticipating the first update of our support of the annual **Catholic Ministries Appeal**.

One of the most frequently asked questions concerning the Catholic Ministries Appeal is how the monies collected by the appeal are allocated. The following is a list of the Catholic Ministries Appeal allocations:

#### 9% - Serving people in need through Catholic Charities

The CMA provides a subsidy to Catholic Charities to support its regional offices/agencies throughout 12 counties serving the poor, elderly, infirmed, and the most vulnerable in our communities.

## **32%** - Providing Diocesan-wide services to our parishes and institutions

The CMA provides funding and resources to assist parishes, pastors, staff, Pastoral Councils, Finance Councils, ministers and chaplains in serving the faithful through Liturgical, Urban, Rural, and Multicultural programs and ministries; hospital and jail Chaplaincy, Finance, Human Resources, Facilities Management, Information Technology, Tribunal, Archives, Communication, Stewardship, and Pastoral Planning Services.

## 7% - Supporting Seminarians, Deacons, and Pastoral Leaders

Your donations to the CMA support the education and professional development of our Seminarians, Deacons, and Pastoral leaders.

#### 5% - Educating our young in the Catholic faith

The CMA helps prepare our youth for fulfilling and faith-centered lives through parish religious education programs, Catholic Schools, Campus Ministry, Sacramental Preparation, young adult and youth ministry programs.

#### 33% - Funding Operations and Support Services

The CMA helps to fund operation of diocesan offices/ministries in the Pastoral Center, including maintenance and capital improvements.

#### 9% - Funding the Ministries of our Pope and Bishop

The CMA gives Catholics the opportunity to extend their reach beyond their parish boundaries to support Vatican Ministries, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, New York State Catholic Conference, the work of Bishop Matano, and the lay advisory councils that guide Diocesan-wide decisions.

### 5%- Supporting the Catholic Ministries Appeal Campaign

It costs five cents to raise one dollar for the CMA, well below the nonprofit industry average. Bless all missionaries in our communities with your love that surpasses all understanding. Change our hearts so that we become the missionaries you expect us to be.


We ask this through Jesus, the first missionary of your Gospel. Amen.

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION:**

With little more than a year until the United States' national elections, I find myself feeling, like many Catholics, both dread and energized. Dread, because our democratic republic can be a messy endeavor and campaigns a long, nasty, and unedifying slog; energized, because hope for positive societal change can be enticing and engaging. As a pastor, I see similar conflicting attitudes in those whom I serve. How can Catholics best engage our political arena in a way which is truly helpful and worthwhile?

This weeks' gospel reading offers wisdom in this regard. Jesus says, "Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." This riddle forces us to answer for ourselves a hidden question: "What is the relationship between political and divine authority?" Two common but false answers lead to mischief. If we answer that the two are equivalent, politics becomes our absolute authority. This happens whenever religion is slave to the state, as in the travesty of the pro-Nazi German Christian movement in the 1930s and 40s. It also usually occurs when there is an official state religion.

If we answer that the two are totally unrelated, we end up with an unchecked aggressive secularist state as we often experience now. Thus, religion becomes a weak and private pastime.
