

GOSPEL REFLECTION —30th Sunday in Ordinary Time:

In our secularized culture, we all struggle with belief in God, at least to some degree. An atheist man named Robert Bridges once wrote to his friend, the Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins, asking how he could possibly learn to believe in God. Hopkins pithily responded: "Give alms." Would that help someone tempted by atheism today, like you and me?

I think so, and here's why. This week Jesus speaks of love for God and neighbor. These dual commands were nothing new when Jesus used them to sum up the Jewish law. What is new is the way he links them together in mutual dependency. In Jesus, God and man have become one. Human-love and God-love are now inseparably married forever.

The newness of the God-man means that there is now a permanently counter-intuitive way into the knowledge and love of God: love of our neighbor. To experience charity is to know God. That's what Hopkins was getting at for his friend. How we treat our fellow human beings is inseparable from faith in God. Do you want to have a stronger sense of God's loving presence and goodness? Commit to serving someone today and this week. Love him or her. Don't wait for love for God to appear in your heart before loving others. Jesus has united divine and human love. If you want to believe more in God, give alms.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:3

It is hard to believe that Wednesday of this week begins the month of November. November is a month where we are invited to "remember," beginning with All Saints Day, followed by All Souls Day on Thursday. November 11th is Veteran's Day, a time to remember all our veterans who have served our nation so faithfully. Later this month we celebrate Thanksgiving Day, which gives us an opportunity to gather with family and friends to offer thanks for all we have. November invites us to remember the past and live for the future, even as we live in these challenging times

A popular song that our children often sing on All Saints Day is entitled "Sing a Song to the Saints." The song mentions a number of the more popular saints of our faith tradition by name, with a refrain inviting us to "sing a song to the saints." All Saints Day is a time to honor the women and men whose lives were marked with holiness of knowing, loving, and serving God throughout their earthly life. This day reminds us that holiness is a virtue for all of us—not just those who have been formally recognized to be so by the Church, but all who have loved God's call the best we can.

Every year on All Saints Day, I recall the occasions when the Litany of Saints is sung and prayed during the liturgy. At the Easter Vigil, we are invited to sing this litany just before the elect are baptized. For those in Holy Orders, the singing of this litany brings back memories of their ordination. Before the bishop imposes hands on the candidate, he lies prostrate on the floor of the church, while the congregation joins the saints in the Kingdom, praying for the soon-to-be- ordained. This litany calls out for assistance and guidance, reminding we that we are not only a part of the church here on earthy, but a heavenly church as well.

Thursday, November 2nd, we commemorate the **Feast** of All **Souls**. While not a day when we are obliged to attend Mass, this day invites us to pray for all the faithful departed. It is a day to remember deceased family members and friends. I often think of all of the former priests, religious, and family members who sacrificed to build our church and campus, who prayed, built community here, and truly loved the people. Think of the many funerals we have celebrated here. How often have we remembered and called upon our ancestors in faith to help., guide, and be with us in the most challenging of times? All Souls Day invites us to remember and pray for our departed loved ones, sad that they are no longer with us, but happy that they are with God in heaven.

Veteran's Day is Saturday, November 11th, with the holiday being observed this year on Friday. This day reminds us that on the eleventh day of the eleventh month in the eleventh hour in 1918, the "war that was to end all wars," World War I ended in Europe. Every year since, we have paused as a nation to remember. We remember those who sacrificed their lives in all our nation's wars so that we might be a free nation. We remember war stories we have heard and continue to pray for peace. We are indebted to every military person who willingly put others ahead of themselves in offering the supreme sacrifice of their lives. Veteran's Day is a day to remember the past so that we


HANDS OF CHRIST AWARD 2024:

CATHOLIC QUESTION:

Answer:
