PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

An early bulletin deadline due to the Thanksgiving holiday weekend finds this column being written on Monday, November 13th, in anticipation of the Thanksgiving holiday. One of the liturgies I look forward to each year is the Mass on Thanksgiving Day. It is a wonderful time for many to come together to offer their personal gratitude to God for the many blessings we enjoy. I hope you enjoyed a wonderful Thanksgiving!

Today, we celebrate the **Solemnity of Christ the** King, and with it the final week of the Church's liturgical year of prayer for 2023. Unlike the feasts which are centered around an actual event in our Lord's life, the Feast of Christ the King celebrates an aspect of Jesus' identity, and this is categorized as an "idea feast." This feast was originally celebrated each year on the last Sunday of October, but with the revision of the Roman Missal after the Second Vatican Council, this feast was moved to the final Sunday of the liturgical year. By instituting the Feast of Christ the King, Pope Pius XI hoped to renew and strengthen the faith of the people of his time and to a world where the influence of totalitarian forms of government such as communism, Nazism, and fascism were gaining a stronghold in many countries, particularly in Europe. It was Pius XI's hope that this annual celebration would serve as a reminder to all of Jesus' reign in our midst, and would speak powerfully of our belief in God's triumph over evil. Christ our King continues to be the source of grace for each of us of being His living presence in our world.

The preface for the Solemnity of **Christ the King** summarizes this day so well:

For You anointed Your Only Begotten Son,

Our Lord Jesus Christ, with the oil of gladness As the eternal Priest and King of all creation, So that, by offering Himself on the altar of the Cross

As a spotless sacrifice to bring us peace, He might accomplish the mysteries of human redemption

And, making all created things subject to His rule,

He might present to the immensity of Your majesty

An eternal and universal kingdom.

A kingdom of truth and life,

A kingdom of holiness and grace,

A kingdom of justice, love, and peace.

It was in October, 1962, that **St. Pope John XXIII** convened the opening of the **Second Vatican Council**, reminding the world's bishops of their special role in bringing the presence of Christ to the world.

Pastor's perspective continued:

. He challenged them "We are not on earth as museumkeepers, but to cultivate a flourishing garden of life, and to prepare for a glorious future."

One of the documents which came from the Second Vatican Council was the **Pastoral Constitution of the Church in** the Modern World (December 7, 1965) Paragraph four is worth noting: "At times the Church carries the responsibility of reading the signs of the times and of interpreting them in the light of the Gospel, if it is to carry out its tasks. In language intelligible to every generation when people ask about the meaning of this present life and of the life to come, and how one is related to the other. We must be aware of and understand the aspirations, the yearnings, and the often dynamic features of the world in which we live."

We believe that through baptism all people are called to be disciples of Christ and to proclaim the gospel. Today's celebration of **Christ the King** is an opportunity for each person to renew his or her baptismal calling to live each moment of their lives with faith, hope, and love. This witness is the foundation as we proclaim the gospel message to family, friends, neighbors and society. Our witness to God's kingdom is strengthened by participation in the celebration of the Eucharist, daily prayer, scripture study, the celebration of the sacrament, and direct service to all people, especially our friends who are most in need.

Have a great week. Next week, we begin a new liturgical year with the First Sunday of Advent. The Advent season is only 22 days this year; so plan to use these days to your best advantage in preparing your mind and heart for Christmas!

CHRISTMAS CARING PROGRAM 2023

Over the years, we, at St. Mary Our Mother, have reached out to help the needy of Horseheads and its many surrounding rural areas. We have done this in partnership with the Horseheads Food Pantry, which serves these families by providing food assistance. Parishioners have generously supported the pantry year-long by donating grocery items to the vestibule cart and clean, empty deposit bottles to the parish office. Furthermore, 25% of the Rice Bowl proceeds that are returned by CRS are then given to help with the expenses of our local pantry.

As the Christmas season of giving and caring approaches, we, at St. Mary Our Mother, will be reaching out to the clients of the Food Pantry in **three** special ways:

- 1. Making a monetary donation so the pantry can supply meat and fresh food for the Christmas meal and the holiday week. Envelopes will be provided on the tables in the back for this purpose.
- 2. Increasing our donations of canned and dried food to the vestibule food cart so the pantry clients have healthy and adequate food for the Christmas holidays.
- 3. Bringing a Christmas ornament that you offer to a needy family. You hang the ornament on our Christmas Caring tree in the back of the church. The ornaments will be taken to the pantry so the families and children can pick an ornament for their tree as a reminder that we care for them.

This program will kick off this weekend, donation envelopes will be available in the vestibule and the Christmas Caring tree will be standing proudly in the back of the church awaiting your ornaments. This program will conclude the weekend of December 9th and 10th.
