PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

We have arrived at the **second week** of the season of **Advent.** Each year, Advent presents us with an invitation and challenge to take some time during these extremely busy and hectic December days to slow down and to be more aware of God's presence among us. Years ago, **St. John the Baptist** preached this message and encouraged people to listen to his message as he proclaimed and prepared the people of his time for the coming of Jesus Advent is a season of anticipation, joy, and hope that comes from knowing that God is in our midst. During these Advent days, I would encourage you to allow God to comfort you and to help relieve any anxiety that you might be experiencing that prevents you from fully entering into the joy of this time of year.

Many of you may remember the late **Father Joseph F. Hogan.** Father Hogan served as chaplain at **Notre Dame High School** from 1955-1961. Upon his retirement, Father Hogan came to live at **St. Patrick Church, Elmira,** the then pastor, Father **Daniel F. Holland** and myself. When he was assigned to be the homilist for the weekend Masses during the season of Advent, St. Patrick had four weekend Masses, (all parishes in Chemung County had 4-5 weekend Masses in those days—how times have changed!) Father Hogan would include the following poem in his homily. I am not sure of the author, but it is entitled **I Promise: My Christmas Pledge:**

- 1. I promise to make my Christmas a holy day with Christ—not a holy day without Him.
- 2. I promise to observe Christmas as the birthday of Christ—not a day to give and receive just material gifts.
- 3. I promise to remember that the real symbols of Christmas are the Star, the Stable, and the Crib—not Santa and his reindeer.
- 4. I promise to teach my children that "Santa Claus" is the nickname for Saint Nicholas, who gave to the poor, in honor of Christ.
- 5. I promise to help one poor family—in honor of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, the poor and homeless family of Bethlehem.
- 6. I promise to send Christmas cards remindful of Jesus, the infant savior—not decorated only with candy canes, ribbons, and wreaths.
- 7. I promise to make room in my home for Christ—with a Christmas Crib—to remind me that He was born in a stable.
- 8. I promise during this season, in a special way, to honor Mary, His mother—who kept the first Christmas vigil beside the manger.

Jubilation to Share

Sometimes you have something to share with people that causes you to well up inside with excitement to the point of going crazy. A pregnancy test, a pay raise, a college acceptance, a wedding or engagement are all examples of moments in life when we might be bursting at the seams to tell somebody the good news. When we finally get the chance to tell somebody, joy just seems to flow through us with ease. We literally want the entire world to share in our jubilation.

When was the last time you shared with a friend or loved one how much your faith in Jesus means to you? You don't feel the same motivation to share? Are you not overwhelmed with a desire to spread the Good News?

Don't feel bad. You are not alone. As Christians, we often fail to grasp the powerful implications of being a disciple of Jesus Christ. We can become complacent and lose sight of what matters the most. That is when sharing with others about our faith seems uncomfortable.

GOSPEL MEDITATION -December 10, 2023 2nd Sunday of Advent

We like to think we are totally free, but the bitter truth is we simply are not. Or better put, our freedom is limited on every side — by governments, corporate giants, physical and mental frailties, genetic shortcomings, and even the boundaries of time and space, and above all, the burden of our sins and pending deaths. In our day, we are perhaps particularly aware that we are not free to disconnect from the technocratic rulers of the air. If you doubt me, try not paying your internet bill and see what happens. We are not totally free.

It's nothing new, of course. In Jesus' day, everyone felt the crushing weight of the Roman Empire. You can say you're free all you want. But try not paying your taxes to Rome and see what happens.

Once we feel this burden in our own lives — however it comes — we are ready to hear the stunning announcement that commences Mark's gospel, "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." It's not a simple perfunctory introduction, but a dramatic announcement of new freedom. The word "gospel" was a political, even military, term. It meant: a great victory has been won and a new king is in charge. This Jesus — not the Roman emperor — is God's son, and He has defeated all that crushes human freedom. It's time to follow Him and be truly free. This week let's refuse to submit our freedom to false rulers — especially that of sin. And let's rejoice that Christ is coming to make us perfectly free from all our oppressors.
