



#### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

Today we arrive at the **Third Sunday of Lent**, oftentimes referred to as **Gaudete**, **or Rejoice Sunday**. Arriving at this mid-point of Advent reminds us of the two-fold nature of the season as a time of the already experienced and the yet to be experienced of God coming among us. There is still enough time of Advent to rejoice as we continue our preparation for Christmas.

The month of December can be a very busy and hectic time of the year as we find ourselves in the throes of Christmas preparation. This busyness can cause us to lose sight of the spiritual importance of the Advent/Christmas season. Each December, the International Catholic Stewardship Council offers suggestions that can help us to keep Christ in Christmas. You may already find yourself doing some of these suggestions.

Give God a very special gift this year: Let this gift be something personal that no one else needs to know about, and let it be a sacrifice. Perhaps your gift will be to commit more time with God daily or a habit you know you should give up. Why wait for a New Year's resolution? Start now!

Celebrate the Advent season: Light the Advent wreath candles each evening before dinner. If you have children, let them offer their own prayers to the Christ child for whom we are waiting.

Read the Christmas story in the Gospel of Luke 1:5-56 through 2: 1-20: Consider reading this account with your family and discussing it together.

**Put a crèche in you home:** Consider having one set that that is "child-proof" that your children are allowed to handle. children love to make the Nativity story their own, and they especially love angels!

Plan a project to help someone at Christmas: Identify someone with a genuine need. Involve your whole family and see how happy you can make someone this Christmas. Many of you did this through our parish's Christmas basket efforts. If you didn't, there is still time. Make sure that your children are involved to make them aware of the needs of our greater community.

Give a surprise gift of service to each member of your family: The idea of giving an unexpected gift of service to members of your family reveals your own love and concern for them. You might consider giving your spouse a day away, running an errand for your brother, or cleaning out your closet for your mother. Make it personal and meaningful!

Send Christmas cards and thank you notes that convey a spiritual message: This is an easy way to share your faith during the Advent season. Don't just sign your name, but include a special message with each card. Set

aside time after Christmas to write thank you notes and help your children write thank you notes for the gifts they receive. This is a wonderful habit for a lifetime, and a good way to foster gratitude for all gifts.

Write a Christmas letter to someone working or ministering in a foreign land: It has been said that receiving a letter when you are far away from home is like opening a priceless gift on Christmas morning, no matter what day of the year! Many people are unable to travel home for the holidays, so it can be a very lonely time for them. Write a special Christmas letter to someone of your choice.

Enjoy an eco-friendly Christmas: Christmas is a time when a large number of people enjoy excess and extravagance, but the environmental cost can be quite dramatic. Arguably, a million miles of unrecyclable wrapping paper is thrown into the trash every year. Look for simple ways to cut down on the waste over this festive period. Where possible, use recyclable wrapping paper.

And most importantly.....

**Attend Christmas Mass together with your family:** 

Make Christmas Mass an important part of your family's Christmas celebration. It is a wonderful way of "keeping Christ in Christmas!" If you don't already do so, perhaps you could start a new family tradition of attending Mass each Sunday together as a family. If you are alone this Christmas or don't have family near you, invite a friend or neighbor to join you for Christmas Mass.

#### A GOSPEL MEDITATION:

Why do we believe in Jesus and the Catholic Church? Why should we continue to do so? We've never seen him face-to-face (at least not most of us, I assume). Most of us have never had mystical visions of angels or saints. We live in the same world as our atheist and secularists friends. Why do we believe in Christ if we've never seen him?

The simple, symbolic answer the Gospel presents to us this week might surprise us: we believe because of John the Baptist. Early in John's Gospel we hear: "There was a man sent from God, his name was John. He came for testimony, to bear witness to the light, that all might believe through him." The Baptist powerfully announces Jesus. This is a historical fact, and it is also now a pattern at work in our lives.

John the Baptist stands for the entirety of the old covenant, everything entrusted to the Jewish people. And yet he prophetically opens the door to something entirely new in Jesus, to the revival and fulfillment of God's promises. In every generation, and in every human life, God continues to do this. He has done it through people named Augustine, Francis, Catherine, Theresa, and countless others. In my life, the Baptist's spirit has come through persons named Eric, Paul, Mary, and Ron. I challenge you to name at least three people through whom God has announced the coming of Jesus in your life. Consciously thank God for their testimony. And let's commit ourselves to listening to the spirit of John the Baptist testify again this week so that we might more strongly believe in the light.

#### THE JESSE TREE:

Advent is a season of preparation before Christmas. The word Advent means "coming" and refers to the coming of Jesus. The season emphasizes a three fold coming, the coming, the coming in the flesh at Bethlehem, in grace through word and sacrament, and in glory on the day of judgment.

Many people go to great lengths to prepare for Christmas, yet fail to appreciate the true meaning of Advent. Advent, when properly observed, helps you realize more fully the coming of Christ and its meaning for you.

Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas and lasts until Christmas Eve. The lessons read in church each Sunday of the season pictures some of the people and events that are significant in the heritage of Jesus.

The Jesse tree has the same purpose, but it expands it by presenting an appropriate story in picture for each day of the season. The Jesse tree is a small tree decorated with symbols portraying the spiritual heritage of Jesus. It is a kind of family tree that was suggested by Isaiah's prophet: Article continued in right column:

"a shoot shall come out of the stump of Jesse."

Our Jesse tree is located in the seasonal shrine. Each day a different symbol of Jesus' heritage will be placed on the tree. We welcome you to step into the shrine and turn over the corresponding scripture for the third week.
