PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

This past week's observance of Catholic Schools Week also marked the beginning of registration for students who are currently enrolled at St. Mary Our Mother School for the 2024-2025 academic year. Registration for all new students to our school will begin on Wednesday, February 14th. If you know of families who have children three years of age through sixth grade this September, now is the time to contact our school office to arrange a visit and tour. After all, this visit could make all the difference in your child's life and education.

The following are some "Did You Know" facts about St. May Our Mother School:

We offer pre-school for children ages 3-4, as well as elementary education and faith based education through grade six, (these formative years provide the strongest educational foundation for our children), facilitating the importance of life-long learning.

We promote the intellectual, personal, social, and spiritual growth of each student.

We provide a safe and welcoming, yet challenging and loving faith based environment for children of all faiths. (15% of our current families who have chosen St. Mary Our Mother School actively practice a faith other than Catholicism).

Our current enrollment is 177 students, and enrollment trends indicate increasing enrollment likely for the next decade.

A multi-cultural student body, with children from numerous ethnic/racial backgrounds. Such an environment instills acceptance and appreciation for all people, and encourages our children to focus on things we have in common.

Character traits of respect, kindness, trustworthiness, fairness, responsibility, and citizenship are taught to every student every day, helping to instill these traits and values in each student. Each day begins with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance and concludes with prayer and reflection.

Our faculty and staff are dedicated, caring and effective people, many with multiple New York State certifications and also remain active with their ongoing professional development. Several of our staff have enrolled their children here because they have seen the academic successes St. Mary Our Mother School provides.

Our school has scored higher than other area schools in New York State testing in ELA (English and Language Arts) and Math

Technology literacy and proficiency begins in kindergarten.

ST. MARY OUR MOTHER SCHOOL REGISTRATION

St. Mary Our Mother School is accepting student registrations for the 2024/2025 school year for grades pre-K3 through grade six. Openings will be filled on a first-come, first- served basis. Parents or guardians who are new to St. Mary Our Mother School will need: birth certificate, baptismal certificate, immunization records and a completed parish commitment form for members of the parish. The non-refundable registration fee is \$200 per family. Both before and after school care are available. HOW BIG IS YOUR GOD!

What would have happened had Moses tried to figure out what was needed to accomplish God's command? One of the biggest arithmetical miracles in the world was required in the desert.

Moses led the people of Israel into the desert... now what was he going to do with them? They had to be fed, and feeding 3 1/2 million people required a lot of food. According to the U.S. Army's Quartermaster General, Moses needed 1,500 tons of food a day, filling two freight trains, each a mile long. Besides, you must remember, they were cooking the food. Just for cooking this took 4,000 tons of firwood and a few more freight trains, each a mile long and this is only for one day (not to mention for keeping warm, and if anyone tells you it doesn't get cold in the desert, don't believe them!)

Let's not forget about water! If only they had enough to drink and wash a few dishes, (no bathing!), it took 11,000,000 gallons each day, enough to fill a train of tanker cars 1,800 miles long.

And another thing! They had to get across the Red Sea in one night. Now if they went on a narrow path, double file, the line would be 800 miles long and require 35 days and nights to complete the crossing. So to get it over in one night there had to be a space in the Red Sea 3 miles wide so they could walk 5,000 abreast. Think about this, every time they camped at the end of the day, a camp ground the size of Rhode Island was required, or 750 square miles.

Do you think Moses sat down and figured out the logistics of what God told him to do before he set out from Egypt? I doubt it. He had faith that God would take care of everything. Let us have courage, we share the very same GOD!
