

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT:

In today's Gospel, Jesus urges His listeners to do two things: to believe in the Good News and to repent. Stewards are called to repent, to be humble enough to open their hearts so they may begin anew, to change existing attitudes and habits, and to act with faith in the Gospel. In this season of Lent, now is the time to ask ourselves whether or not we truly believe in the Gospel; and if we do, to what extent are we willing to change our prevailing habits and be more faithful to the Gospel?

As we mark President's Day, February 19th, let us pause and remember the words of President Abraham Lincoln on prayer.

"I have been driven many times upon my knees by the overwhelming conviction that I had no where else to go. My own wisdom and that of all about me seemed insufficient for the day."



ST. MARY OUR MOTHER SCHOOL REGISTRATION

St. Mary Our Mother School is accepting student registrations for the 2024/2025 school year for grades pre-k3 through grade six. Openings will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Parents or guardians who are new to St. Mary Our Mother School will need: birth certificate, baptismal certificate, immunization records and a completed parish commitment form for members of the parish. The non-refundable registration fee is \$200 per family. Both before and after school care are available. PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

The diocesan-wide **Day of Penance and Mercy** will be this Thursday, February 22, 2024. On this day, many parishes throughout the diocese will be "open for forgiveness, offering people the opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance individually. We will offer the sacrament on Thursday from 11:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. In recent years, especially after the pandemic, there seems to be fewer people taking advantage of this sacrament, but I haven't notices an equal drop in sin.

The following may be a few reasons why people might be avoiding this sacrament with some short responses added..

Reason 1: "I haven't been to individual confession in years! I don't know what to do?" No problem, just ask the priest to guide you through it.

Reason 2 "I prefer to confess my sins directly to God and be forgiven; I don't need to go to confession." Our sins not only offend God, but also disrupt our relationships with everyone else. We need to be reconciled with God, the Church, and all people through this sacrament.

Reason 3: "I don't know what to confess anymore!" Do a quick examination of Conscience, and ask yourself: how holy and good are my relationships with God, myself, the people around me everyday and the wider world in which I live? Be honest and thorough with yourself, and you will know what to confess.

Reason 4: "I am embarrassed to mention my sins to another person, to say nothing of a priest I may see at a parish, school, or community events." Chances are pretty good the priest won't remember what you confessed-trust me on this!! Please remember that the priest cannot say a word about it or let it color his thinking outside the confessional. But there is something reassuring to have the personal assurance from a priest that God forgives you!

Reason 5: "I find myself confessing the same sins over and over again! Welcome to the human race! That is why we need forgiveness over and over again! It is also a reminder to us that God gives us mercy over and over again!

Pastor's perspective continued:

Reason 6: "I may need more than just a few minutes for spiritual direction about my sins." If this is the case, you can always make an appointment with a priest to discuss the state of your spiritual life. The sacrament was never intended to be an opportunity for individual counseling and therapy.

Reason 7: I am afraid of shocking the priest!" Really? Try me!

Reason 8: "I am afraid that the priest will ask me to change my life." If there is something that is wrong in a person's life, change will be needed. The priest may make some suggestions to you but it will be the Holy Spirit, not the priest asking you to do so.

During one of our parish retreats, Father Simeon Gallaher, O.F.M., Cap, offered a very practical summary for a person preparing for the Sacrament of Penance. Father Gallagher's approach is four basic steps:

Step one: Name it (name the sin);

Step two: Claim it (admit/claim ownership of the

sin):

Step three: Tame it (open yourself to God's grace; Step four: Aim it (go forth living a life renewed).

Have a great first week of Lent. Please continue to take care of yourself and each other.


