PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

This weekend, we welcome **Father William Donnelly**, a priest of the Diocese of Rochester, as our guest homilist at our Sunday liturgies. Father Donnelly is no stranger to St. Mary Our Mother, as he served as pastor of St. Mary Church in Elmira, from June 1992, to June 1997. Before his two stints as a pastor he also served a six month period of time here at St. Mary Our Mother. We look forward to Father Donnelly's presence with us, as well as his message on ministry of "Unbound," a Catholic sponsor-ship ministry that serves children and the elderly in a number of developing countries.

Last Monday, St. Mary Our Mother hosted one of three diocesan recognition ceremonies for the **Hands of Christ Award**. This award is given annually to high school seniors who have consistently lived and incorporated Catholic values in their local parishes, schools, and the grater community. This ear, we have eleven high school seniors who received this recognition. Their names are printed in today's bulletin. We offer our sincere congratulations to these high school seniors, their parents, families, and friends.

The topic of **Immigration** was a very controversial subject in the recent elections, and continues to be so. Since the elections, many, if not all, Roman Catholic Bishops have written pastoral letters to their people on this subject. On January 30th, **Bishop Matano s**ent an extensive letter to the people of the diocese on this topic. Toward the end of his letter, the Bishop writes:

Reasonable people, yes, including Catholics, see the need for law and desire a well-ordered society, but these laws must be just. And "Justice," true justice must be accompanied by faith, the faith that gave us the immortal Ten Commandments, beautifully summed up by Jesus: "Love God, love your neighbor" (Matthew 22: 36-40, Mark 12:30-31). Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life." (John 14;1-6), the foundation upon which just laws rest, laws respecting the dignity of every person, laws that call us to accountability, laws that punish crime, laws that do not paint broadly with the same brush as individual persons, neither grouping them as "deplorables" or "illegals." Rather, as the true jurisprudence, it "will produce the greatest advantage to the community."

Copies of Bishop Matano's complete letter on Immigration are available in the church vestibule. It is well worth your reading.

As I look at the calendar, I realize that we are already 40 days into the new year of 2025. I also realize that the beginning of Lent is less than one month away. It is never too early to begin to think what you will do to make the season of Lent, 2025, a time of spiritual renewal and growth during this sacred season.

PRACTICING CATHOLIC – THE CATCH:

Mini Reflection:

What does it mean to lower your net? It means to listen to God, even when you don't understand Him. It means to keep trying the hard thing that you know is the right thing. It means to keep loving the person who is making life hard on you.

The Catch

I love today's Gospel passage, and not just because I love a good fish fry.

I love it because I am Peter. Over and over again, I am Peter, standing here exhausted because I relied on my own abilities, and it got me nowhere. I'm ready to call it guits. I'm ready to say it's too hard. And here comes Jesus, asking me to lower my net. To keep trying.

And I try to talk sense into him. "It's not going to work, God," I insist. "I've been trying."

"You've been trying," Jesus agrees. "But you haven't asked for my help yet."

What does it mean to lower your net? It sounds so simple and so easy, but it takes a great deal of humility and trust. I think I'm the expert on my own life, the captain of my own ship. Peter probably thought so, too — he was the fisherman, after all. Why would a fisherman listen to a carpenter on matters of fishing?

Lowering your net means giving God control and letting yourself be changed by what He chooses to show you.

It means to listen to God's instructions, even when you don't understand them, even when you find them frustrating. It means to keep trying the hard thing that you know is the right thing, even when it hasn't born much fruit. It means to keep loving the person who is making life hard on you, even when all you want to do is give into feelings of bitterness and distrust.

If we would only lower our nets, the catch would astound us.


